Rotary International President Visit



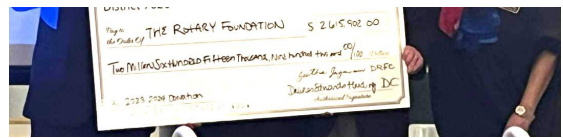

Metro Bethesda Rotary Awarded a \$77,696 Ukraine Basic Education & Training Grant

On February 16, 2024, Rotary International informed Metro Bethesda Rotary (mBR) that we have been awarded a \$77,696 Basic Education & Training (BEL) Rotary International (RI) global grant. The grant is called is a Hanson grant, which means neither mBR, nor District 7620, nor RI contributed any funds to this grant; the entire grant funds were paid for by the generous Hanson family grant (this family is filled with committed D7620 Rotarians including deceased PDG Robert Hanson).

This grant provides basic education and learning for 962 first grade Ukrainian children in the two war-torn regions of Kharkiv and Dnipro. The grant provides payment of schoolbooks, learning cards, classroom desks and chairs, classroom blackboards, PCs for the 8 first grade teachers, laptops for 65 remote students, and PC projectors and a large PC wall monitor for each of the 8 participating primary schools.

Current D7620 Vice Governor and PDG Barton Goldenberg from Metro Bethesda Rotary spearheaded and wrote the global grant application with the help of Iryna Odytsova, a Rotarian colleague located in Dnipro, Ukraine. Iryna is president of the Dnipro Novyi Rotary Club (she has the grey dress on in this photo taken with her club members); Iryna's club will soon commence implementation of this wonderful global grant with assistance from our grant partners.

A new command post trailer is being acquired by DAUSA to facilitate disaster work when local accommodation at disaster zone is scarce. We request that you and your club consider

Command Post Trailer: This multi-purpose command post trailer, when acquired, will operate not only as a command post but also as bunk house, equipment storage, kitchen, and bathroom facility for the deployment team. Carroll Creek Rotary's Bikes For South Africa Featured in Rotary Africa Magazine

Bikes for Africa

In a global community development initiative spanning three continents, the Rotary Club of Carroll Creek (D7620) has sent the first shipment of used bicycles from Calgary, Alberta, Canada, bound for the port of Durban.

The Rotary Club of Carroll Creek is collaborating with the Rotary Club of Empangeni and the Satellite E-Club of Kimberley - The Karoo Region (D9370) to collect and ship 6-12 forty-foot containers of used bicycles to South Africa over a three-year period. The goal is to address poverty and improve access to education and healthcare in rural communities.

The international service project involves training local community members as bicycle mechanics, responsible for assembling, repairing and maintaining the bicycles. The shipping containers will serve as on-site storage and repair facilities. Young women will be enlisted as bicycle mechanics and receive training in basic business management skills.

Rotary clubs in Western Australia, Africa and North America, including the Carroll

Creek club, are actively involved in collecting and distributing the bicycles. Partnering with Rockville MD-based Bikes for the World, the project has collaborated with allied bicycle organisations on three continents.

Bicycles For Humanity chapters in Calgary, Alberta (Canada), Seattle, Washington (US), Charleston, South Carolina (US) and Western Australia are also part of this initiative.

The lead project coordinators, Stephen Bamonti of the Rotary Club of Carroll Creek in Frederick, MD US and Jonathan Moore Warner of the Rotary E-Club of the Karoo Region who is based in Frederick, MD US, are spearheading the efforts. The team also includes Andrew Killick and Fulvio Pace of the Rotary Club of Empangeni and Richard Jones of the Satellite E-Club of Kimberley - The Karoo Region.

The next shipment is anticipated to come from The Porter-Gaud in South Carolina as the initiative gains momentum in its mission to provide bicycles for transportation to school, employment and healthcare in South Africa.
