MARCH 18. 2024 MESSAGE FROM THE DISTRICT GOVERNOR

Dear Fellow Rotarians:

Sometimes I feel it takes me weeks for my body to catch up for that lost hour. Director Elect Patrick told us he remembered his first club meeting as President, and that he was so nervous that he couldn't hold and read his agenda. Patrick told us that one of his Past-Presidents named Ralph, took him in under his wings, and helped him become a better President, public speaker, and leader, and that all of us need to help our Club Presidents become better leaders and to be a Ralph. PDG Tiffany was probably one of the most passionate speakers I've ever heard, and she told us we all need to be passionate about our purpose in Rotary.

I left CPETS excited about Rotary and the upcoming year with anticipation of seeing our new Presidents in action. Thanks to incoming Governor Randy Smith, his Training Leader PDG Susan Giove, and the facilitators who volunteered from District 7630 for providing an atmosphere where our future leaders could learn from them and from each other

Thanks for all you do to Create Hope in the World.



RI PolioPlus request from each Club:

RI PolioPlus asks for \$1,500 per Club per year from each Rotary Club. Our District Leadership feels that is an unfair burden to smaller Clubs versus larger Clubs.

The District has determined that if every District Member gave at least \$40 a year to PolioPlus, it would equate to 1,500 per Club. (# of Clubs x \$1,500 divided by the # of District Members = \$40/Member).

Annual Fund â€" Share contribution as of March 8 2024 - \$152,769 (2022-23) \$228,186 47.5% of Share total to World Fund - \$72,565 (LY \$114,093) 47.5% of Share total to District Designated Fund (DDF) - \$72,565 (LY \$114,093) DDF is used each year for District Grants 50% and other 50% for Global Grants and Polio Plus
