DECEMBER 4, 2023 MESSAGE FROM THE DISTRICT GOVERNOR

Dear Fellow Rotarians:

While most of the stores we shop in have had holiday displays for several months and have been advertising big sales with their lowest prices of the year to remind us that we need to think about holiday presents, it's not until Thanksgiving that a lot of us think we need to start our shopping and preparing for the holidays we celebrate. Once December 1st gets here, we start to see many of our Rotary family helping other non-profit organizations get ready for the biggest time of their year. While reviewing the social media pages of our Rotary Clubs this week, I noticed that clubs have already started to help the Salvation Army by ringing the bell at their annual kettle drive. My Rotary Club will do that next week.

This coming Thursday evening, our Jewish Rotary Family members will celebrate the first religious holiday of the month when the Festival of Lights or Hanukkah officially begins. In Hebrew, Hanukkah means "dedication†and the holiday marks the re-dedication of the Temple in Jerusalem in the 2nd century BC, after a small group of Jewish fighters liberated the Temple from occupying foreign forces. Inside the temple they found a tiny supply of pure oil that they used to light the menorah, and it stayed lit for eight days. The ritual of lighting a nightly candle, as well as the emphasis on cooking foods in oil, such as potato pancakes called latkes, memorialize this miraculously long-lasting oil.

The Recommended Rotary Club Bylaws also ask every Rotary Club in the world to celebrate its rededication each year by holding your Club's annual meeting no later than December 31st to elect the officers and directors who will serve for the next Rotary year. Right now, your Club's Nominating Committee should be meeting to consider and solicit club members to fill the open slots on your club's slate of officers and directors. Please nominate and elect not just a club president for the Rotary year of 2024-25, but also elect a club president to serve for the Rotary year of 2025-26. The continuity of leadership is especially important to the vitality and growth of your club. Please give your incoming Presidents the time they need to learn more about Rotary and to prepare to lead your club. Once your club's president and secretary for the next Rotary year have been elected, please go into the Rotary International website to My Rotary and report this to Rotary International
