Rotary Around the World

Finland

Rotary members are working with the **Finnish Environment Institute** to collect, categorize, and measure trash in the Baltic Sea. "Scientists have little time for this kind of work," explains Liisa Stjernberg, a past governor of District 1420 and a member of the Rotary Club of Helsinki City West. Stjernberg, the Finland country coordinator for the **Environmental Sustainability Rotary Action Group**, leads a group of volunteer members from her district who monitor blue algae blooms, raise funds for research, and promote marine conservation. In September the group enlisted 22 **Rotary Youth Exchange** students to join a measurement outing off the islands of Suomenlinna. They fished out trash including polymer fibers and shock tube detonators used in construction, Stjernberg says. Afterward they took up their oars for another cause: the Rotary-led "Rowing for Herring" longboat regatta, which drew 300 participants.

CLUB REPORT JANUARY 11, 2023

he Eastern Connecticut Workforce
Investment Board serves both job-seekers
and employers - striving to provide workers
with the skills they need for available jobs and to
ensure employers have workers with the specific
skills that are needed.

David J. Allard, senior manager of talent acquisition for the workforce board, provided members of the New London Rotary Club on Thursday, Jan. 11 an overview of services and benefits the agency provides to the region.

"We have a one-stop approach," Allard said, referring to the myriad of training programs, internships, job fairs and on-the-job training designed to move people directly from training and skill development to a job. The workforce investment board also works with employers to identify the specific skills they need in workers. They then work with the would-be employees to ensure they have those specific skills.

"We have two customers - job seekers and employers," he said. For job seekers, the board focuses on the unemployed and underemployed. For employers, the board helps ensure businesses have the workforce they need to be competitive. One program pays half to three-quarters of new employees' wages while they are training on the job at companies that have contracted with the workforce board.

There are three specific goals of the workforce board, Allard said. These are to help residents prepare for jobs that improve their quality of life, to ensure employers have access to the workers they need to thrive, and, finally, to support overall economic vitality for the region. Both in-person and virtual programs are offered.

In eastern Connecticut, the investment board oversees programs in 41 towns and focuses on jobs in two major sectors: healthcare and manufacturing. It has offices in Montville, Willimantic and Danielson. The workforce board partners with numerous community groups to help provide all the programs and services offered.

In eastern Connecticut, the three major challenges to employment are transportation, affordable housing and access to childcare, Allard said. The workforce board aims to provide job seekers with the training programs that will provide them with the best opportunity for employment. Often, baseline skills can also help pave the way for other types of jobs, he said. For example, most entry-level healthcare jobs may require Certified Nursing Assistant training, but having CNA certification also can open up other opportunities in higher level jobs. In the area of manufacturing, basic skills can be useful in areas ranging from carpentry to electrical, along with factory-type employment.

"It's really a matchmaking effort," Allard said. "We align people with the training programs that are best for them."

Job training programs through the workforce board culminate with job search assistance.

"We try to get people to work as soon as possible because they have an economic necessity," he said.
