

The Rotary Club of Olds, Alberta, is livening up its process for awarding grants to community groups. In November, representatives of about a dozen organizations pitched their proposals at a contest modeled on Dragons' Den, a CBC television program (much like Shark Tank in the U.S.) in which venture capitalists judge entrepreneurs' proposals for investment. The organizations were allotted five minutes to make their pitch, followed by five minutes of questioning by a panel of Rotarian "dragons," or judges. Club President Randy Smith concedes that the awardees would have received their share of the roughly \$10,000 regardless of who won. But he says the spirited affair gave the groups, including Interactors



and fire department cadets, an opportunity to hone their presentation skills and showcase their creativity.

INTER-CLUB MEETING MARCH 13, 2024

New London Rotary joined several area clubs, including Groton, Niantic, Waterford and Mystic at a multi-club meeting at Flanders Fish Market in Niantic. It was a full house and wonderful opportunity to mingle with our fellow local Rotarians. Each club announced its "Un-sung Hero" award recipient. New London's was Gail MacDonald. After lunch we listened to a presentation by Safe Futures, who was to be the beneficiary of the event.

Safe Futures, established in 1976, serves much of Southeastern Connecticut. Its missions is to stop abuse, restore hope, and the save lives of those impacted by domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and trafficking.

Safe Futures strives to eliminate violence in our communities so that southeastern Connecticut becomes a place:

- Where violence and abuse are not tolerated;
- Where all victims and survivors are able to get the support and resources they need to create a new life for themselves; and
- Where all children and teens feel safe, and learn the skills to establish healthy friendships and dating relationships.

For the fiscal year 2022, Safe Futures served 10,000 victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and trafficking in our area. It provided 114,986 total services with 29,812

victim contacts and 10,657 calls. Their work included advocacy, criminal, civil, and law enforcement, counseling, support and safety planning.

In alliance with Camp HOPE America, Safe Futures offers a camping and group mentorship program for children in Southeastern, CT. who have been impacted by trauma. Its mission is to help these children find pathways to hope and healing.

Representative from Safe Futures shared plans for a new building, scheduled to be built this year. It will be conveniently located in Waterford, accessible by bus. It will be a centralized facility where victims come first and professionals come together. This single, safe location will provide victims faster, more comprehensive and integrated care. The 21,000 square foot building will house office and conference spaces for Safe Futures and more than 20 partners. It will house medical exam facilities, private interview rooms, reading and playrooms for children, training labs in computer learning, a virtual courtroom and court support services. It will also have facilities for helping with life skills, law enforcement and more.

We Rotarians are proud to support Safe Futures in its mission to help and provide hope in dealing with the tragic and sometimes deadly problems of abuse.
