

Peace Through the Arts

obert Friend, District Governor Elect, former NL Rotary Club member & Marketing Specialist for the Garde Arts Center, visited our club on Thursday, March 28, 2024. Commenting that he attended his first Rotary meeting when he was ten with his father who was a Rotarian, he recalled not being back to our Club for ten years. He is currently a member of the Madison Club. As a friendly face at many District meetings, Robert is a welcome figure in our district. He remembers fondly working with Barry and others on a Rotary fundraiser with Broadway stars appearing at the Garde, which ultimately raised \$90,000 for the eradication of polio. He began his career in Performing Arts in Boston after receiving his degree from Emerson College and working at the Long Wharf Theater. He has been heavily involved in entertainment technology for 20+ years. As an Assistant Governor of the District for 8 years, he endeavored to open up the District's public image. He and his wife, Maribel, who is from the Dominican Republic, have three children. He is inspired by the concept of leveraging Rotary to raise funds, so he and DG Rick Benson did a Global Grant with Mercy Ships to take medical care to the Dominican Republic. He encouraged all members of our Club to attend the District meeting on April 20 in New Haven where many informative sessions are planned on International projects, technology, and saving lives through Rotary.

During his year as District Governor, Robert will be focusing on the topic of Peace and Culture Building Through the Arts, which will be internationally motivated. There will be Zoom sessions with Clubs around the world including those in Ukraine, India, Afghanistan, the UK, etc. A sample project with Ukraine might be a camp for children in the northern part of the country to give them a sense of peace and normalcy. As peace is the framework for next year with the RI President elect, Stephanie Utricht, who spoke at a district meeting in New Haven last month and at PETS in February about the theme, Robert in support is promoting the concept of "Opus for Peace." He hopes to be able to inspire harmony, wellness and understanding through the arts, with musicians and artists participating in a joyful celebration of peace



and the arts. When asked how he will tie technology into the project, Robert answered that he will have an ongoing video blog and pod casts, where he will interview guests, share videos on Saturday mornings and open conversations on peace through the arts on Friday afternoons. Robert has secured several venues for unique presentations including The Garde, which will sponsor a film festival for peace, and the Bushnell Theater, which will host the Amistad Opera. In sum, this effort will elevate the image of Rotary in the state. The arts bring healing, break down barriers, disrupt complacency, and encourage critical thinking. Before concluding Robert gave us a few dates to keep in mind: April 20, the District Assembly in New Haven, and June 23, his Installation as District Governor at Water's Edge.
