

Presidents' Message



James Ussher, the Church of Ireland Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland between 1625 and 1656, published a chronology of Creation of the world in two volumes (1650 and 1654). In these texts he placed the date and time of Creation at nightfall on October 22nd, 4004 BC. Personally, I love the story of Ussher and his chronology. His dedication, research effort and knowledge of history were nothing short of amazing in his time. Another option for the creation of the Earth is 4.543 billion years ago – plus or minus 50 million years. Alternatively, if you consider the Creation to include not only the earth but the universe, then maybe 13.7 billion years ago plus or minus 200 million years is the right number for you. Regardless of which numbers you believe, very serious scholarship has gone into the calculation

of all three numbers and I look up to the men and women who persevered to reach their various conclusions. Now, what does all this have to do with Rotary you ask? For me, Rotary means that regardless of whether you believe the earth is 6027 years old on Sunday evening, the 22nd of October or you believe the 4.543 billion year estimate, or something entirely different, we can join forces in fellowship and with good will to do great work that needs doing. Rotary has done great works for decades and continues the work now and into the future. We collaborate with people of all faiths and no faith; all income levels; all ages, all colors, all flavors of gender and sexuality, all everything. These tenets all fit easily under the umbrella of the 4-Way test: In particular, "Is it fair to all concerned". Let's all continue to strive to be fair to everyone.

One of the good works of Rotary is the effort to eradicate polio. This Tuesday is World Polio Day. Before our speaker we will have Assistant District Governor and District PolioPlus Chair Jane Falls speak to us about this important work, and yes – the importance of funding this work *if you are able to contribute*. After Jane we will hear from Dr. John Rogers about a great local business success story.


