Summary of last week's topic:

Steve Vincent introduced our "special agent" guest Ian Hunt founder of SunSpear Games an Esport gaming company located in Medford and with offices in the Netherlands, Chili and India. Founded in 2017 they are mostly private funded and employ about 30 people with a goal to increase their employee base to 100 over the next two years. Ian shared the myth that most video gamers are children the truth is over 65% are adults with over 50% of those being women who play social media games on mobile devices.

Dr Linda Schott, President of Southern Oregon University spoke to us on how SOU first connected with Esport games. In 2016 when the University of California at Irvine announced its new Esport program, an area and scholarship program they were officering SOU became very interested to learn if we could form our own team. There are about 500 universities and community colleges offering Esport teams. In 2020 SOU started its Eports program they were the first university on the west coast to offer an academic program minoring in an Esport Management Program and hope they will be able to give out scholarships soon. Rotary Foundation's Polio Plus program, By Eric Hodnett, Co-Chair - Polio Committee

District 5110 places an emphasis on Polio during the month of February. With that in mind I thought I would share some information that from a recent issue of the Rotary Magazine.

You may wonder what your donations to the Rotary Foundation's Polio Plus program go toward. Onemonth last year the Rotary Foundation approved the following grants:

- 19,306 vehicles were hired for frontline workers in Afghanistan
- 90 million doses of oral vaccine
- 12,139 vaccinators were trained in Sudan
- 2,530 community health workers recruited in Pakistan

Remember, all donations to the Rotary Foundation Polio Plus account are matched 2 to 1 by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. A \$100 donation generates \$300 toward polio eradication.

Finally, it has been recognized how valuable the polio eradication infrastructure is for other medical responses. Currently this infrastructure is being used in many countries for their Covid-19 response. We should all be proud of that as well.
