the orphanage in Haiti called
Hearthstone Village. Nancy once
traveled to Haiti on a medical
mission and decided to look for an
orphanage to sponsor and came to
love Hearthstone Village. At the
time it housed 27 girls. At this
time, it is unsafe for any of the
usual volunteers and sponsors to
travel to Haiti as it's become too
dangerous. It's a small, all

volunteer, non-denominational, non- profit organization dedicated to education, nutrition, and healthcare for the communities in need. The girls study business, law, medicine, and literature. Some of the girls are now in medical school. Because of the situation in Haiti, they are desperately in need of donors to help continue funding the needs of the organization.
