Deanna gave an insightful presentation about teaching first responders to help themselves with the terror and trauma they experience as first responders. She learned that more first responders die from suicide than actually in the line of duty, as well as have a 15-year shortened life expectancy and 70%

divorce rate.

PROGRAM

Speaker- Keith Rogal- Sonoma Development Center



Keith Rogel is a property developer based in Napa, known for being a visionary in reimagining properties into world class communities. His notable projects include the Carneros Inn in Napa Valley, and the Napa Pipe redevelopment project. Keith's development philosophy is guided by the principles of New Urbanism, a movement in urban planning and design that promotes

walkable mixed-use communities. This guiding principle is something Keith hopes will be achieved through the transformation of the Sonoma Development Center into a vibrant, community destination. Keith's presentation should the plan, including the housing, retail, recreational and green space facilities. A separate boutique hotel will be built slightly away from the main property. The SDC parcel is 945 acres, with 785 acres to be left as natural or protected open space. There will be 90units of housing, including mixed-use buildings, apartments, townhouses, co-housing, large and small detached homes, courtyard homes hillside homes, duets and triplets, and independent living residences.
