Craig Lazzeretti, Managing Editor of the Rossmoor News

Craig Lazzeretti has been with the Rossmoor News since 2020 and was promoted to the managing editor in 2024. He previously worked in various roles for the Bay Area News Group of daily newspapers. Lazzeretti was a member of the team of the East Bay Times which won a Pulitzer Prize in 2017 for the story about the Ghost Ship Warehouse fire in Oakland.

He fell in love with journalism from the time of his involvement in the high school newspaper. He went to San Franciso State University with a concentration in journalism.

Ann Peterson is the editor of the Rossmoor News and is on vacation this week; Lazzeretti works more on the communication side of the paper and hands-on production and operations. With the reduction in the amount of community and daily newspapers focusing on local news, he is so gratified with the role of the Rossmoor News, which provides residents with a variety of content devoted to what the clubs and individuals are doing as well as upcoming events.

The goal of the paper is to bring to residents' attention the plans of the Rossmoor Walnut Creek (RWC) organization in addressing the needs of the community. The role of the newspaper is to state objectively what the issues are, and the challenges and trade-offs of decisions impacting Rossmoor. RWC values journalism and does not want to bury something that may be controversial.


The Rossmoor News is funded by advertising as well as from the coupon each resident pays. The advertising of realtors, local vendors and restaurants help provide for a full-time staff and the operational expenses. Lazzeretti explained that while the RWC Board of Directors shapes policies, it does not interfere with journalistic decision making. While AI is now part of our lives, the Rossmoor News does not have the confidence to rely on it for editing content. There are also no plans to eliminate the "print" version of the Rossmoor News.

Suggestions from Rotarians included a request to keep publicizing trash tips. He also promoted the continuation of our residents providing ideas for stories.
