PROGRAM



Rick H. spoke about 19th century worldwide "gold rushes." As a graduate in geology and mining engineering, Rick is well versed. He has given many presentations about the history and significance of gold rushes. He talked about 6 major gold rushes around the world, not just in the Americas, and their social and political impact. The quest for individual freedom encouraged mass immigration. The opportunity to make one's life better motivated action. A downside is that this pursuit led to war and conflict.

An upside is that the gold rushes fostered trade, and economic expansion. Six major gold rushes were described in No. America; North Carolina, Georgia, California, Pikes Peak Co, Cripple Creek Co, and the Klondike Ak. He did not go into detail about So. Africa, Central and South America, and

Australia.

Some very famous expressions came from the gold rushes. "There's gold in them thar hills"-Georgia. "The Trail of Tears" about the relocation of the Cherokee Indians from Tennessee to Oklahoma. And "It's a Guy Thing," which expresses that most miners were men. However, women were also engaged in mining pursuits.

Rick talked about the various technologies employed in seeking gold; panning (or placer mining), rock and cradle rocking, sluicing, hydraulic, and dredging.

Finally, one anecdote struck me. Where did OZ from the Wizard of Oz come from? OZ (ounce) was the measurement of gold.

It was a fully satisfying history of something all of us Californians know something about.
