### **PROGRAM**

Our subject today is the Lumumba Children's Library and Learning Center. Our speaker, Debbie Koo, is a member, and past president, of the Moraga Rotary. She is now Rotary's International Service Chair. Moraga Rotary sponsors the Lumumba Children's Library and Learning Center (LCL), in Goma, DRC (Democratic Republic of the Congo). It is located near Green Lake and is three minutes from downtown Goma. Goma is a city of 1.5 million people, but has no library. Many there have never even held a book. The Center's goals are literacy, trades, and critical thinking. It is to be a tech center and community center.

Moraga's undertaking is in conjunction with the Goma Rotary Club, spearheaded by Fidel Bafilemba, who founded the Goma Rotary and is considered a local hero for all his contributions to the community. He worked before on Rotary's polio elimination programs. During the pandemic, he distributed masks made locally, as this was cheaper than having them made in the US and then sent to Goma. He embodies Rotary's motto: Create Hope in the World.

The Center is located at the foot of one of the world's most active volcanoes, Nyiragongo. It erupted on May 24, 2021, and there were mass evacuations. The Moraga Rotary sent volcano relief to the Goma Rotary Club, corn and sugar. Fidel helped people navigate this crisis, damage from which led to relocation of the planned Center. Construction finally began on a new site in July 2, 2022. The cement blocks used for the building are made individually on site. No big construction equipment here. But there are experienced engineers. The grounds are terraced, making learning gardens, for the over 200 edible plants in the Goma area. Native art is being painted on the inside of the Center's security walls.

The area is a growth hub. It is close to Rwanda, and has camps for IDP's (Internally displaced Persons). The Center will have potable water for the community. Pictures from April 30, 2023, show how much progress has been made building the Center.

For more information, Fidel has written a book, *Congo Stories*. And Facebook has pictures under Congo Library.

The Center is applying for Global Grants, and could use our financial help.
