PROGRAM

Speaker: Lynn Forette from the Assistance League, Diablo Valley Chapter. There are 120 chapters nationally. The local chapter is involved with 20 programs primarily helping children and seniors. They run a thrift shop in Lafayette. There are 460 members in the local chapter with only 1 part time paid bookkeeper.

Some of their projects:

Operation School Bell - 3,300 kids were helped with clothing and uniforms including 185 homeless kids. Jackets and shoes are frequently what are most needed. In the Pittsburg Bay Point area \$11,800 went for books for 2nd graders. The program provides1 on 1 reading tutoring, and a weekly arts program for 2nd and 5th graders at Shore Acres Elementary. Over 500 Sunshine Boxes a month are providing nonperishable easy to fix food for weekends.

Scholarships \$206,200. There have been 53 awarded this year including 15 teacher scholarships totaling \$6,448. These enable teacher to get what they need to augment their classrooms.

Community Needs Focus - Programs include Tele Care, Food Boxes, Baby bags, Assault survivors kits, See Ya sponsorships, On My Own Kits (kids exiting foster care) Kits for babies and children awaiting foster care placement.
