Speakers for the Day — Alexis Madrigal

Ahmad Anderson introduced Alexis Madrigal, author of *The Pacific Circuit*.

Alexis told us his mom had been a Rotarian in Vancouver, Washington. His book, *The Pacific Circuit*, describes Oakland's role in global economy, and centers in West Oakland. It began during the Vietnam War when supplies needed to be sent across the Pacific Ocean. The Port of Oakland became the first on the west coast to be able to ship cargo containers. The Port had the land for creating the loading area, container storage, and access roads.

Seventh Street provided the truck access, although it required removing housing and closing many businesses. BART now runs down 7th Street also. At the same time, the air is now 70 – 90 percent cleaner.

The takeaways are: Oakland is part of the integrated regional picture.

Damage has not been repaired – there is lots of space for remediation.
