

Doing Business with Rotarians

Coach Joe thanked **Lorna Padia Markus** for the excellent meal he and Martha enjoyed at **Lorna's** new restaurant in El Sobrante, PJs, currently open during its soft opening period.

Speaker for the Day — Tim Gardner

Coach Joe invited Marleen Sacks, of Marleen Sacks Law Firm, to the podium to introduce today's speaker, Tim Gardner. Marleen characterized Tim as a government watchdog and newshound, and a cofounder of the Oakland Report weekly newsletter. His topic was The Infinite Unknown. It concerned the value of uncertainty in life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

Tim began by thanking a colleague who accompanied him here today, Sean Reinhart, who began as a volunteer and has now assumed leadership of the Oakland Report, his weekly free newsletter that uses reasonable evidence-based analytics to comment on Oakland activities. He said that in preparing remarks for today, he asked himself how to be politically interesting without being political. Tim said his remarks are centered on the city of Oakland, tribalism, and threading those equations. He will attempt to persuade us that uncertainty is a superpower, because it is actually the key to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

The Oakland Report is a civic news and commentary site launched in 2023, in response to alarming reductions in city services. He mentioned the graffiti ordinance which holds businesses responsible for clearing graffiti on their property, the fact that taxes are collected annually for a city pension fund that has a surplus and is largely funded, 15% deficit spending, and a lack of realistic decision-making about school closures. Tim objects to an assumption that voters are not interested in verifying what they read about city decisions. He said primary evidence, rigorous analysis, and a dispassionate voice are essential to honest government. Tim referenced Erwin Schrödinger's equation, considered the foundation of modern astronomy and physics, which, although it is a law of nature can never be entirely proven. An insistence on truth necessitates healthy doubt, because when we frame our analysis with doubt, we are open and sometimes arrive at truth. Tim posited that too often civic life presents a disregard for evidence and truth, turning instead to ideology.

Coach Joe advised Tim that the first principle of Rotary's Four-Way Test is "Is it the truth," thanked him for his remarks, and gave him a Rotary Four-Way pin and announced a donation to End Polio Now will be made in his
