

The group talked about all the different offerings Fairyland has from birthday parties, to after-hours adult events, to their annual gala. Kymberly has a dream of eventually installing a large ferris wheel in the park.

President-Elect Joe Goralka hosted the group. Oakland Rotarians started with a champagne reception while learning the story of the Polar Bear and 7 ft. beer stein at the front of the store. They had lunch in the CEO's office among the huge Mettlach stein collection

Current East Bay President Jonathan Breznikar spoke about family history and company statistics, plus explained types of services offered. Currently \$80 million in sales is down from \$100 million. At 99 years old, it is one of the top 20 largest foodservice distributors in the nation. They are currently bidding an \$8 million casino kitchen renovation.

Bob Breecker took home the raffle prize, a professional Vitamix food prep. Members then toured and shopped in the 60k ft. warehouse showroom floor with over \$ 10 million of foodservice equipment and supplies to explore. Rotary fellowship was had by all.



Lodestar Charter School

Rich Harrison, CEO of Lighthouse Community Public Schools, hosted the group. Lodestar Charter School is a Lighthouse Community Charter School located in Oakland. They have 712 students in attendance. The school is divided into TransKindergarten to 5th Grade, and 6th to 12th grade.

SOSMeals on Wheels

Rosemary Darden, Mark Miller and Karen Friedman visited SOS Meals on Wheels at their San Leandro headquarters. The group was hosted by Kim Olson, SOSMOW's Director of Advocacy and future Rotarian. During lunch the group learned about SOS Meals on Wheels work to serve a daily nutritious meal and wellness check to homebound seniors in Alameda County. They took a tour of the SOSMOW Kitchen, which produces 2,000 to 2,500 meals a day, and met

with Eric Gremlin, Head Chef, who shared his passion for cooking delicious food, despite the program's strict dietary guidelines. They also learned about volunteer opportunities to help prep and deliver

Oakland Hills Campus

About ten Rotarians visited the Oakland Hills Campus the new name for the former Holy Names University. Club member Dan Cardenas, who is the Director of Operations for the new campus, led our group on a tour of the property's highlights. The campus has a new 450 seat theatre, and class and conference rooms that can accommodate meetings of just about any size. There are also student dorms, a dining hall, computer labs, a library, a hospital nursing training facility, and a gym, including a Division 2 basketball court where NBA players sometimes practice that blend in well with the campus' open landscaping. BH Properties, the new owner, is currently renting portions of the campus on short term or single event leases. However, the longterm expectation is that the campus will host a college or trade school consistent with the property's current zoning as a site for above-secondary school education.

Oakland Zoo

Eleven members and guests journeyed to the Oakland hills for a Brown Bag visit to the Oakland Zoo. The group boarded the gondola and arrived at California Trail for lunch in the Habitarium classroom. During lunch, Zoo CEO and Oakland Rotarian **Nik Dehejia** discussed the zoo's conservation efforts locally and around the world, wildlife rescue activities, volunteer opportunities, and the business of operating a zoo.

Lunch was briefly interrupted so that the group could observe the four Brown Bears enjoying their enrichment treats just outside the classroom and Habitarium windows. The visitors received a selection of the new "Get to Know Your Bay Area Neighbors" animal cards, including Coyote, Opossum, Wild Turkey, Black-Crowned Night Heron, Raccoon, and Raven cards. About half of the group participated in a tour of the California Trail, led by Oakland Zoo trustee and docent, and Oakland Rotary Past President **Michael Bruck**.
