

***Easy broccoli chicken casserole.  
Make it!***

## INGREDIENTS

1x 2x 3x

- 6 slices of bacon
- 12 oz bag of microwavable fresh broccoli florets
- 1 rotisserie chicken shredded
- ¼ cup green onions sliced & divided
- 8 oz sour cream
- 4 oz whipped chive cream cheese about half of a 7.5 oz container
- ¼ cup milk
- Half a packet of hidden valley ranch seasoning
- 8 oz shredded double cheddar cheese blend

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Preheat the oven to 400°F and cook your bacon for about 15 – 20 minutes or until crispy.
2. While the bacon is cooking, take a bag of microwavable fresh broccoli florets, pierce the bag with a fork, and microwave it for only half the time it says to microwave it on the package (I microwaved mine for 2.5 minutes). Once the broccoli is done or green and crisp, take scissors and cut the broccoli up into smaller pieces (as small as you would like them to be).
3. Grease a baking dish and add the broccoli pieces to the bottom of the baking dish. Next, add the shredded rotisserie chicken in an even layer over the broccoli. Then, sprinkle about ⅓ cup of sliced green onions evenly over the chicken layer.
4. In a measuring cup add sour cream, whipped chive cream cheese, milk, and the hidden valley ranch seasoning. Whisk that together until fully combined and smooth. Add that creamy mixture to the baking dish and smooth it out so it's an even layer over the chicken, broccoli, and green onions.
5. Now, take your crispy bacon, chop it up, and sprinkle it evenly over top of the casserole. Then, sprinkle the shredded cheddar cheese evenly over the top. Lastly, sprinkle over ⅓ cup of sliced green onions. Bake the casserole in the oven at 375°F for 25 minutes. Enjoy!



# Recipe Corner



## *You can use!*

Scanning a QR code carries several scam-related risks because QR codes can encode any link or action, often without the user realizing what they're about to access. Here are the main risks:

**Phishing and Spoofed Sites:** Scammers can create QR codes that lead to fake websites designed to look legitimate (e.g., banking or delivery sites). When you enter your information, it's stolen by scammers.

**Malware Installation:** Some QR codes direct your device to download malicious files or apps. This can result in malware infecting your device and stealing personal information or credentials.

**Payment Redirection and Theft:** Fraudsters may place counterfeit QR codes over legitimate ones (e.g., at parking meters or payment terminals). Scanning these could send money to the scammers or capture your financial details.

**Data Tracking and Collection:** Some QR codes are used to collect extensive metadata, like device information, IP address, and location, often without your knowledge or consent.

**Social Engineering:** Scammers frequently distribute QR codes via email, SMS, mail, or even on posters. Messages might create urgency ("urgent account issue" or "undelivered package") to increase the chance people will scan without thinking.

**Fake Apps or Invasive Permissions:** Malicious QR code scanner apps (instead of trusted, built-in phone camera apps) may request excessive permissions to access your device, network, or files.

**Remote Access Threats:** In some high-profile cases, QR codes have been used by attackers to trick users (including members of critical organizations) into granting remote access or installing remote administration tools.

Due to the nature of QR codes, users can't easily check the underlying link before scanning. For best protection:

Only scan codes from trusted, verified sources.

Preview the URL after scanning and before clicking.

Avoid entering sensitive information on sites reached from QR codes unless you've confirmed their legitimacy.


