




A trip to Berlin Roger and Dahne Watson

Roger has played significant roles within local mental health coalitions, spiritual wellness initiatives, and community efforts to integrate faith-based support into the mental wellness field.
- Dahne Watson: Activities and Interests
 - Dahne Watson is listed as Secretary for Kings Counseling Center, sharing involvement in both its operations and governance. Professionally, she is known for her skills in nonprofit organizations, event planning, conflict resolution, and administrative roles, including adjunct faculty positions in higher education settings. 

- 1 Heat 1 tablespoon of sesame oil in a large, non-stick skillet over medium heat. Add the shrimp and season with $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon of salt. Cook the shrimp for 1 minute on each side, until just pink. Remove from the pan. ▶
- 2 Add the remaining tablespoon of oil to the pan. Toss in the mushrooms, asparagus, and remaining $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon of salt and sauté for a few minutes, until the vegetables begin to soften. ▶
- 3 Add the ginger and soy sauce and sauté until the ginger is fragrant, about 30 seconds. ▶
- 4 Toss the shrimp back into the pan and mix until everything is well incorporated and the shrimp is fully cooked, about 1 minute. ▶
- 5 Divide the mixture evenly between 4 bowls.


