DEVICE ADVICE

⚡ **3-second tech genius:** Your phone finds hidden cameras. Open your camera app and slowly scan a hotel room, Airbnb or changing room. Hidden cameras with infrared lenses show up as a bright purple-white glow on your screen. Your camera sees light your eyes can't. Or get the [hidden camera detector](#) (33% off right now) I use.

✈️ **Don't throw your phone into a TSA bin:** Wallets, cameras and phones go missing at checkpoints more than you'd think. Tuck valuables into a zipped pocket of your bag or coat before the belt. Small electronics can stay in your carry-on during screening, too, so don't feel suspicious doing it. And if something ever does go missing during screening? [File a claim at the TSA website](#). Keep that in your back pocket.

Cooking mode

INGREDIENTS

- 1lb hot pork sausage
- 8 oz cream cheese, at room temperature
- 4 oz smoked Gouda cheese, shredded
- 2 cup all-purpose baking mix (such as Bisquick)
- 1 tbsp ranch seasoning mix (from a 1-oz envelope)

Million Dollar Sausage Balls

- 3 Roll mixture into 1-inch balls and place evenly spaced on the prepared baking sheet.
- 4 Bake until golden brown and cooked through, about 20-25 minutes, rotating the pan halfway through baking.

▶ 22:30

- 5 Let cool on the pan for 5 minutes before serving. Best enjoyed warm.

STEPS

- 1 Preheat oven to 375°F. Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper or lightly grease with cooking spray.
- 2 In a large bowl, combine 1 lb hot pork sausage, 8 oz cream cheese, at room temperature, 4 oz smoked Gouda cheese, shredded, 2 cup all-purpose baking mix (such as Bisquick), and 1 tbsp ranch seasoning mix (from a 1-oz envelope). Mix until fully combined — using your hands works best to bring the dough together evenly.
