Thailand Water and Sanitation Project Submits Proposal for \$2M Program of Scale

In early October, our team received the exciting notice that our Thailand Water and Sanitation Project was one of the three projects invited to submit a full proposal to the Rotary Foundation for a \$2 million Program of Scale.



Initiated by the Fig Garden Rotary, our current project is in its third and final year, bringing clean water, sanitation and economic freedom to 21 villages in the remote jungle highlands of Northern Thailand. Inspired by the notion that life begins with clean water, 31 clubs and 6 Rotary Districts donated the money in partnership with the Rotary Foundation World Fund to raise \$330,000 for a global grant. The project has been extremely successful, but there are still hundreds more villages in Thailand without clean water. A Program of Scale award would allow expansion of our clean water and sanitation project to another 145 villages in the jungles of northern Thailand.

Rotary is built on relationships. When I was District International Service Chair, I met then Rotary Foundation Coordinator for Zone 25A, Gladys Maldonado at the Rotary Convention in Houston, Texas (shown with me in the photo). Our discussions resulted in our club serving as the international sponsor for a global grant to purchase hospital equipment to serve pregnant Venezuelan women receiving treatment at the border city of Cúcuta, Colombia. The result was not only improved health care, but also a relationship that was cemented by a 2024 visit to Cúcuta, joined by then Rotary International President Gordon McNally. While there, we also visited a Venezuelan project fair and were inspired to initiate a new global grant: an intensive care unit for the San Cristobal hospital.
