

Soon after serving twenty years in the USAF, Sean began learning about the history of his culture. Today, his work centers around research and synthesis of cultural knowledge used in consultation with more fifty local, state and federal agencies to address the cultural impacts of project development. In his work, he interacts with museums, archeologists and government agencies. He also performs repatriation of ancestors, works to restore his traditional language and focuses attention on a Cultural Council that

seeks to revive his tribe's authentic history.
