KEY DETAILS

- Shifts are 3 and 1/2 hours long (inside or outside) and you must stand the whole time (other than during a 15 minute break for water/snacks/bathroom).
- Parking for volunteers is at Santa Anita Park with shuttles to and from the house. If you can't get dropped off and picked up in the blocks surrounding the Showcase House, you should also factor in around 40 minutes to an hour for that process **each way**.
- Your job will be to greet guests, answer basic questions, and direct traffic through the house.
- If you complete TWO separate shifts, you will receive a **free ticket** to tour the Showcase House any day after 1:30 p.m.

If you'd like to volunteer, let our coordinator, Amanda Pumilia, know which days you're available for and which shifts you'd prefer. She will schedule your shift(s) and send a confirmation with the date and time.

After the Pledge of Allegiance, George Riccciardella gave the inspiration, a story from comedian Steve Martin about how Los Angeles is a city that rises from the ashes both metaphorically and literally.





We had just one guest this week – Nick Giovanazzi, the Community Engagement Coordinator from Pasadena Heritage. We gave him a warm Rotary welcome.

President Elect Hillary then reminded us that last week's speaker, Zoot Velasco, is an Altadena Rotarian, and during her conversation with him he mentioned that since their meeting place at the Altadena Town & Country Club was destroyed in the Eaton Fire, he really misses his Rotary badge. That gave Hillary and President Elect Elect Tammy Silver an idea! The Pasadena Rotary Board met and decided that it would be a great idea for

Pasadena Rotary to replace the Altadena Rotary badges that burned in the fire. Hillary channeled Sally Struthers in the old "sponsor a child" commercials (https://youtu.be/ePENcrE_xcQ?t=56), and urged us all to sign up to sponsor an Altadena Rotarian by replacing their badge. 
