



This Week's Program

JUDGE CRAIG MITCHELL SKID ROW RUNNING CLUB

Introducer: President Mary Lou Byrne



Craig Mitchell attended UCLA. After college he taught high school in South-Central Los Angeles for 17 years. While teaching he attended Southwestern Law School at night. Following law school he was a deputy district attorney in Los Angeles for 11 years. As a prosecutor, he handled primarily murder and sexual assault cases. In 2005 he was appointed to the Superior Court by Governor Schwarzenegger. He currently presides over a felony trial court in downtown Los Angeles. He is married and has three children – one a teacher, another a marriage and family therapist and another a lawyer.

In 2012 he founded the Skid Row Running Club to bring the benefits of running to those on Skid Row who were participating in programs to overcome addiction and homelessness. Members of the SRRC run three times a week, complete on average three marathons a year, as

well as other running events. Every year, members who are faithful to the program, compete in an international marathon. The SRRC has traveled to Ghana, Rome, Berlin, Israel, Vietnam, Ecuador and most recently to Egypt where 50 runners from Skid Row participated in the Egyptian Marathon in Luxor. In the last 10 years, hundreds of runners have maintained their sobriety, obtained stable housing and full-time employment with the assistance of the SRRC. While running is central to the program, it is the sense of community, mutual accountability, even a sense of family – that is the vital component that the SRRC provides to its members.

This remarkable organization is the subject of a full-length documentary, SKID ROW MARATHON. The documentary has won awards in over 20 film festivals worldwide.

Robin Salzer introduced today's speaker and his best friend **George Falardeau**, who spoke about his Life in Show Business.

George first talked about his current role as Executive Director of Pasadena Media. Next month, he will convert his membership to a Pasadena Media Corporate Membership. He introduced his staff, Chief Operating Officer Chris Miller and Director of Production Bobbie Ferguson.

Before he joined Pasadena Media, **George** spent 22 years as Senior Vice President of Real Estate and Operations for ArtCenter College of Design. *Before that,* he worked for NBC, retiring as Vice President of West Coast Operations.

This is one of these speakers where, if you weren't

there, you missed a lot. This column could recap the speech word for word and you would still miss something because there was a lot of great video footage.

First up was a video of **George** dancing on American Bandstand in a borrowed jacket that was too big for him. **George** was showing off such classic moves as the Swim. He also started attending live tapings of the Bozo show at KTLA studios. There he was enraptured by all of the stage craft - the lighting; the technical stuff; the set pieces.

After that he became a cameraman. One of his gigs was to join Bob Hope for his Christmas Special Live from Beirut in 1984. **George** got paid \$1000 a day which was a lot of money then, especially for someone so young. Of course, he risked life and limb being in the war zone. He told a marvelous story about Bob Hope: They were on this luxury 747. All of the plane was decked out as first class. There was a lot of food. **George** was sitting two seats away from Bob Hope. The captain came over and informed everybody that they would be stopping in Newark and the plane needed to refuel. Everybody would spend the night in the barracks, get showers and more food, and head out in the morning. Bob Hope said "no no that's not good enough. We need to continue on tonight. Get me Casper on the phone." *Casper* referred to Casper Weinberger, Secretary of Defense. They got Casper on the phone and **George** overheard Bob conversation. "Casper, I gotta get to Beirut. The troops are expecting me. I can't wait." Sure enough, when they landed in Newark they got out o the plane onto the tarmac. Then, a C139 large cargo plane rolled in, dwarfing the 747. **George** and everybody else got on that plane and flew to Beirut, where they lived on an aircraft carrier and taped the show.

In another video, **George** showed a clip of Johnny Carson's arrival at NBC studios for the taping of his last show. Johnny drove his own car, refusing to be driven. He also didn't want any security. So **George**, now Director of Operations, had 10 plainclothes officers following Johnny, unbeknownst to Johnny of course.

George had a lot more stories but as 1:30 approached he stopped and there was no time for questions. **President Mary Lou** presented him with his speaker's gift.

Then **President Mary Lou** closed the meeting with: Imagine what YOU can do this week, to build community through service!




