

Robert Ritchie, who goes by Roy, was born in Scotland, moved with his family to Toronto, Canada, and then to California. He received an undergraduate degree at Occidental College, then a PhD in Hstory from UCLA. His specialties are early American History and early modern history of England. In 1969, Roy joined the faculty at UCSD where he became a full Professor, then Associate Chancellor in 1986. Roy left UCSD in 1992 to become Director of Research at the Huntington Library. He retired as Director in 2011 and assumed his current position as Senior Research Associate.

Roy has received numerous awards and fellowships, including from the Regents of the University of California, the Danforth Foundation, American Council of Learned Societies, and the National Endowment For Humanities. Roy has served on many Boards and Committees for colleges, historical institutes, and associations.

He has authored many publications including The Duke's Province: A Study of Politics and Science in New York 1664-1691, Captain Kidd and the Pirates and The Lure of the Beach: A Global History. His current project is a History of Needwood Forest in Staffordshire, England.

THE SCOOT ZONE

The room was abuzz because there was a familiar face seated at the piano. **President Mary Lou Byrne** called the meeting to order and confirmed what we all could see - **Ross Jutsum** was back in the house! Ross gave a hearty "Hello, Pasadena Rotary!" He started off with the tune of *Imagine* and the words "imagine Pasadena Rotary' but he stopped and said he couldn't think of any more lyrics. So, instead, we sang a medley of patriotic songs.





Dean Billman gave the inspiration. He asked us if we knew that in 1974, women could not have a credit card. Most of us knew. Ruth Bader Ginsburg, before she became Justice Ginsburg, was instrumental in getting the Equal Credit Opportunity Act passed, as well as other women's rights achievements. An interviewer asked her "when do you think there will be enough women on the court?" justice Ginsburg replied "when there are nine." In response to criticism, she said there have been nine men and no one ever mentioned that was a problem.

President Mary Lou announced that Pasadena Rotarian **John Grech** passed away. **John Tegtmeyer** brought us the news and will speak a few words in his honor next week.

Pasadena Rotarian **John Burrows** also passed away. **Past President John Cushman** spoke a few words in honor of his friend. John Burroughs attended University of Iowa and was a great supporter of the school Including setting up a family scholarship fund. Between Rotary clubs, Council Bluffs, L A5, and Pasadena, he was a Rotarian for 40 years. His father was also a Rotarian for 40 years.





John had three sons. Scott died of cancer. His son Doug was killed by a hit and run driver. **John** never stopped fighting to bring Doug's killer to justice. He used his relationships with law enforcement developed in the LA5 club, so he could continue the investigation. Eventually the culprit was apprehended, tried and sentenced to jail. He wrote a book about it - *Justice for Doug*. (Part of the Kindle Unlimited program!) **John's** surviving son, Matt was in attendance.

After that much bad news, we were eager to turn to better things. **Ross Jutsum** was given an honorary membership in Pasadena Rotary. **President Mary Lou** told us that **Ross** had led the music for the meeting more than 1500 times. He also wrote a Rotary theme song and performed it before 10,000 Rotarians from all over the world at the Rotary International Convention in Philadelphia.

Ross took the stand and told us a story about how he sat on a plane next to the recently departed Vin Scully. Everybody was asking about the Dodgers. Ross said to him "I'm Australian. I don't know anything about baseball. I only know cricket." Vin said "no problem" and they spent the next five hours discussing all of Vin's favorite places in Australia. Ross took us through a

rousing rendition of Take Me Out to the Ballgame.



Then it was time for the Rotary Service Star awards!

Wende Lee earned her star by volunteering for the South Pasadena Tournament of Roses float building committee. She spent 5 days gathering bougainvillea from yards all over Pasadena, South Pasadena and the surrounding towns. Finally she had enough for the edge of 1 boot.

Jeannine Bogaard earned hers by volunteering every other Saturday at the Friends in Deed Food Pantry.

Past President Cathy Simms earned hers by being a court appointed special advocate for two foster brothers in the court system.

President Mary Lou said next week she wanted to have her first male recipient of the Rotary Service Star.

Past President Cathy Simms retook the podium to update us on the progress of Caring Little Hearts our third global grant in partnership with the Rotary Club of South Madras in India, was fully funded and since the beginning of the Caring little Hearts Program, we have provided heart surgeries for 400 children. Recently the Rotary Club of South Madras brought together 40 families whose children have benefited from the operation to come back for reunion. Cathy shared a slideshow of the pictures they sent.(See write up and photos below)

Introduction of guests included Lisa Kroese who has completed her application for corporate membership; Christine Reeder, who lead the one city one story program in Pasadena was guest of **Catherine Hany. Joel Sheldon** was in attendance with his lovely wife Jill, and our speaker's husband Randy Wilson.

Past President Diana Peterson-More introduced our speaker, Judy Wilson. Judy has been involved with the festival of women authors since its inception in 2009. It began as a fundraiser for the Pasadena Senior Center and was originally held at the Senior Center for many years.

Judy is on the committee of readers and each member reads three or four books a week and writes a report about each book and then they come together and share ideas and pick the authors who will appear at the festival.

There are four main authors in the ballroom and then there are three debut authors that are in smaller settings while the main ballroom was being set-up for lunch.



There are many things that go into picking a recipient but one of the criteria is that they have to be a great speaker. It's not enough to be a great writer sometimes you have to be a great speaker too, they make it very clear that it's not just a reading of the book but a presentation.

Many of the writers are on speakers bureaus and get 30 to \$40,000 per appearance. The festival only offers transportation and accommodations plus a \$1000 honorarium. However they have developed a reputation and are often able to get authors to come without significant renumeration.

Selecting winning writers is a lot like painting a Golden Gate Bridge. You get to the other end and start all over again. Their search for new writers begins the week after the festival each year. Judy shared some of her success stories in August of 2019 they signed up Sigrid Nunez, author of The



Friend: A Novel. In November of that year she was awarded the National Book Award for fiction.

Pasadena Senior Center only held 350 people and in 2016 they were sold out and there were 250 people on the waiting list. They had to find a new home. They formed their own 501C3 corporation and move to the Pasadena Hilton where they continued to support Pasadena Senior Center but also included other local nonprofits. In 2019 they once again outgrew their home and had to move to the Pasadena Convention Center. They had a very successful festival this year after two years off for COVID.

President Mary Lou presented Judy with the speaker's gift, appropriate for a writer. It was a pen and blazoned with the Pasadena Rotary motto service above self.


