Simply Stephen Smith's Spokes Speaks

Dear Rotarians,

When I stepped into my leadership role, I was enthusiastic and had a clear vision for introducing new initiatives to our club. Various unforeseen factors, alas, quickly transformed my initial excitement into a test of patience, strategy, and personal growth. However I end the year proud of what we have accomplished together, most notably the successful launch of our Impact Club.

In July 2024, at the start of my term, DACdb reported our membership at approximately 220. This number was inaccurate, as about a third of these members had not attended a luncheon in years. Earlier this week, DACdb reported our membership at 142, with 61% considered "active" members. Of these 142 members, 72% are over 60 years old, indicating that we, like so many Rotary Clubs, are an aging club.

To address this, drawing from numerous Rotary-sponsored seminars and online training I introduced the "Impact Club" program. This program has been in existence for decades, and my intention was to infuse our club with younger members who are ready, willing, and able to participate in service projects. These projects would, to some extent, supplement

the work of our Done in a Day Committee. For those unfamiliar with the "Impact Club," it typically consists of younger members who may not be able to afford the monthly membership costs and are often employees who cannot take time off work for a couple of hours each week. They only pay for the lunches they attend but are considered "regular members" by Rotary International as they pay monthly dues. Most importantly, their primary role is to perform service projects for the club. Although there have been some bumps along the way, I am proud of how our Impact Club is shaping up.

As we all know, the Eaton Fire occurred on January 7th, 2025. It started basically in front of my house, under a Transformer, along the foothills in Altadena. I ended up on my roof, with my garden hose, for many hours, putting out embers not only on my house but my neighbors to the north and south, who were not home. It was quite the Apocalyptic evening. One I will never forget.

The irony is that the day before, The Co-chairs of the Fundraising Committee, Lisa Cavalier, Deb Lewis and I, sent out invitations about the Fundraiser that was to be held at the end of February. Both women had to resign from their respective posts as Deb Lewis lost her house and Lisa Cavalier got swamped with the aftereffects of the Eaton Fire.

In its place, I pivoted and set up a Fundraiser to be held at the end of June, with Karl, whose father was James Powers, the car designer who came up with the T-Bird concept when he worked at Ford. James was also a Retro-futuristic illustrator whose designs have been exhibited in the Smithsonian. His car collection consisted of 37 classic vehicles as well as 3,000 model cars, not to mention his artwork. Karl, a real estate developer, had spent \$2 million on his father's property to update it. He was under the gun to complete the work by the end of June as he was also selling his homes in Beverly Hills and moving into a portion of the property.

Peggy Kelly and Paul Roach stepped into the shoes of my previous Fundraising Chairs and did a spectacular job in attempting to set up this event by the end of June. Bottom line, through no Rotarian's fault, a few weeks ago Karl apologetically asked if we could move this Fundraiser event to September. He was also amenable to making copies of some of his Fathers illustrations to auction off. It was a big blow, but I am hoping we can still make this event happen in the next Rotary year.

Despite the frustrations and disappointments that I have dealt with during my term, I want to say that Pasadena Rotarians are incredibly wonderful, kind, and generous people and I will miss the kindness and professionalism that so many of you have exhibited to me and my wife.

I wish Pasadena Rotary nothing but the Best. It is a wonderful service club with a very bright future.

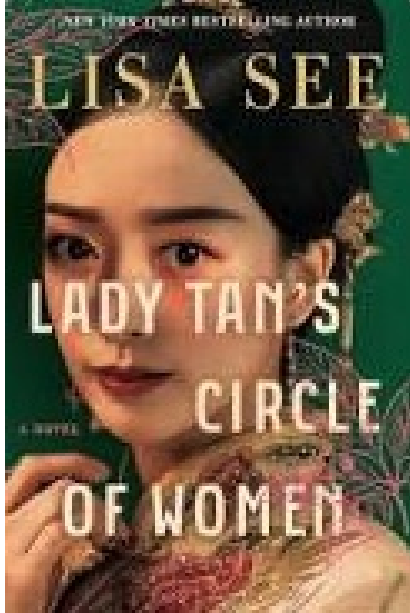


ROTARY READERS
