In Jim Osterling's 43-year career in the real estate industry, he has served as a senior executive and board member for several developers, including California Pacific Homes and Shea Homes, both as CFO, and currently is on the board of Villa Riviera Estates, building affordable housing for Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital employees. He was an Adjunct Professor at the USC School of Planning teaching Real Estate Development and Finance. In 2002, he founded Bridge Advisors, a real estate development and advisory company.

Jim has been involved in the development of projects with a value of over 5 billion dollars in a variety of property types including residential, affordable housing, retirement, retail, office, industrial, self-storage, resort, golf course, aviation, and master-planned communities.

Jim is a trustee for Pasadena City College, representing Seat #2, and served as the Vice-Chair of the Altadena Community Standards District (CSD) Committee, which updated the land use policies.

Jim earned a BS in Business from Iowa State University and his MBA from Northwestern. He is a CPA, member of the Urban Land Institute and served on the government affairs committee of the California Building Industry Association.

Past President Phil Miles gave a primer on what District 5300 does. On behalf of the District Governor, PP Phil presented **Fred Findley** with his badge for serving as *District Treasurer* (!!) for the next 3 years.



Judy Taylor, co-chair of the TYROS committee, announced that the September lunch will be moved in honor of Rosh

Hashanah. There will be two lunches in October – the 3^{rd} and the 30^{th} , both at California Pizza Kitchen at noon.

There were a lot of Polio Pig announcements. For 35 years, Rotary International has been the leader in the effort to



eradicate polio in the world by vaccination programs. The efforts were so close. Only Pakistan and Afghanistan still had cases. This year, the fight is sliding back, including a case in the United States, which was one of the first areas declared polio free.

One of the ways we raise funds for RI's effort is to allow people to make non-Rotary announcements for a minimum \$20 donation to feed the Polio Pig. All of the money is passed on to Rotary International.

Past President Scott Vandrick announced that the Pasadena Symphony and Pops is holding its annual fundraiser, Moonlight Sonata, under the iconic dome of City Hall. The recipients of the Philanthropist Luminary Award will be Past President Ken Hill and his wife, Freddie. Saturday September 24th starting at 5:30

pm.

Lisa Cavelier announced that their annual Black Tie and Burgers event is going back to the 1980s to celebrate 85 years of the Boys and Girls Club. October 15 in Centennial Square in front of City Hall.

Mark Waterson (who donated \$50!) announced that the Convalescent Aid Society needs **volunteers** for its Ninth Annual Garden Party on October 2nd at 4 pm at the Chevy Chase Country Club.

George Falardeau introduced our speaker, Opera Singer Nandani "Nani" Sinha, who began voice lessons at the age of 9 and gone on to sing with the LA Opera and the Santa Barbara Opera. Why talk about her singing when you can hear it for yourself? Nani showed us a portion of a video of one of her performances. You can view the entire piece **here**.

Her career is not what Nani came to speak about. Nani's father was a Mensa member, Ph.D. and college Professor. At first, he started forgetting things like when he was to pick up his kids. His problem progressed until he was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease





Alzheimer's is on the rise. While deaths from heart disease declined 7.3%, deaths from Alzheimer's increased 145%. 1 in 3 seniors dies with Alzheimer's or another form of dementia. Current medical research hasn't agreed on the cause or causes but more importantly, there is *no known treatment* to cure or even slow the progression of the disease.

Nani discovered the powerful effects of music on patients with Alzheimer's. During the pandemic, she formed Music Heals Minds, a non-profit dedicated to bringing engagement-centered programs to Memory Care communities.

Nani shared moving stories of the results of their work. A song can bring a patient alive, The singer will engage the patient with trivia questions about the song. Soon enough, the patient will begin engaging not only with the artist but with their family members, telling stories and sharing memories.

Songs can also calm a patient stuck in the terror of their own minds. She shared a particularly poignant story of interacting with a man who only spoke Korean. In college, she had a roommate who taught her a Korean children's song. She sang it to him, and his agitation quieted. The staff can now use it to calm his night terrors and go back to sleep.

The members asked many questions and shared some of their own experiences of family members with the disease. Then **President Mary Lou** gave Nani the speaker's gift.

President Mary Lou closed the meeting by noting that the Nani is a prime example of Imagine what you can do to build community through service.


