CHIEF RUEDA: BEHIND THE SCENES WITH THE JANUARY 7TH FIRES

Fellow Rotarian and San Marino Fire Chief Mario Rueda provided us with a big picture context for the January 7th fires while also giving us specific things we can do to protect ourselves as we live in an area that will always be subject to fire danger. Even before the massive fires broke out on

January 7th, there were warnings of extreme fire risk due to the forecast of unusually high winds and the very dry (low humidity) conditions. His own force was underhanded due to a flu bug so the remaining members as well as the entire police department was pressed into service, helping neighboring cities and responding to non-stop calls from residents. 

Frederic C. Sohl Sergeant-at-Arms suffered substantial damage from trees felled by the high winds. But it could have been much worse. If you want to be sure you are doing everything you can to reduce your home's fire risk, you can ask the fire department to come out—free of charge--and do an inspection.




DISTRICT TRAINING ASSEMBLY Friday, April 11, 9:30 am to 1:00 pm
