**Another Great Program on September 8th** 

Water, or the lack thereof, was on everybody's mind last week as we braved scorching temperatures and passed yellow lawns in San Marino (of all places, heaven forbid) to attend a timely program offering answers to the state's recurring water crisis. The presentation by Mr. Luis Cetine of the Metropolitan Water District did not disappoint. I knew it would be a good program when John Morris showed up and vouched for Mr. Cetina. John, who is also an emissary from the City Club, is considered "water royalty" in these parts. Not only has he served for decades on the governing boards for local water districts, but his grandfather was a close associate of Mulholland. There is even a dam in the San Gabriel Mountains named for the Morris family. With such a compelling program, I was surprised that local newshound Mitch Lehman was not on hand to report on it. Alas, he has many bases to cover in San Marino. I'm guessing the Garden Club inducted a new member. Although I cannot cover the presentation like Mitch would, allow me to provide a brief recap.

From 125 years of good records, we know that multiyear droughts are normal in California and that they are trending worse. There is considerable water in northern California that could be sent to the aqueduct system but is currently lost to the ocean. For over 65 years there has been a plan to build a new reservoir and a conveyance system to get this water across the Sacramento River and into the system. This would answer our water needs and would be the most cost-effective solution, but is opposed by environmental groups claiming it will harm the fish. Other proposed solutions, such as desalination and recycling, are much more expensive. Desalination is difficult because the California coastline property is very expensive and highly regulated. The desalination process also requires a lot of electricity.

In other words, we're stuck. So keep conserving water.

For the second week in a row, record temperatures did not keep people away from our meetings. I give credit to our president who, after many years living in Arizona, is unfazed by the heat and exudes an air of unflinching coolness. I've heard he is rated for up to 112 degrees, which will come in handy should the Motor Classic face a heat wave in the future. Some of the men, unable to match Rob's natural immunity to heat, resorted to wearing short pants as part of the "heatwave casual" fashion trend for the summer. Even the city's vice mayor and UC-Berkeley grad bared (or beared) his legs to beat the heat. And yet, members continue to venture back.
