International Committee Update

Breaking News from the International Committee, courtesy of J.P. Mainguy "Our Club and our Rotary District 5300 approved this week an exciting International Project with the Rotary Club Panipat Royale in India. The objective is to deliver a complete dialysis system to the health center operated by Shree Sant Jinda Kalyan Charitable Trust in their facility in Surat, India. This will benefit 35 to 75 patients per week who are mostly below the poverty level and above the age of 50. There will be no charge to patients under the poverty limit while others will pay a nominal fee of about \$4 per visit. Our Club International Projects Committee contribution of \$6,000, plus a kind \$1,000 donation from future member Michel Roy (special thanks to you, Michel!) will be added to the donation from the Panipat Royale Rotary Club and the important matching from Rotary Districts and The Rotary Foundation. The total amount for this Rotary Global Grant is \$42,000. As you can see, when Rotary clubs get together, our San Marino Club contributions can have a significant impact worldwide."

Meet Jennifer Jones, President of Rotary International.

San Marino Rotary can collaborate with other Rotary clubs overseas because we are an international organization with an international governing body called Rotary International or "RI" for short. Each year there is a new president of RI, just like there is at the club level and district level. This Rotary year, the president of RI is a woman named Jennifer Jones. I mention the gender only because she is the first woman to serve as president in the 115-year history of Rotary. You might remember that women weren't even allowed to join Rotary until about 40 years ago, starting with the Rotary club in nearby Duarte. A lawsuit ensued that went all the way to the Supreme Court. But that story is for another day. The important thing is that we have a very well qualified person leading RI. Jennifer Jones has been a Rotary member since 1997 and has served Rotary as RI vice president, director, training leader, committee chair, moderator, and district governor. She played a lead role in Rotary's rebranding effort by serving as chair of the Strengthening Rotary's Advisory Group.

Jones is the founder and president of Media Street Productions Inc., an award-winning media company in Windsor. She was chair of the board of governors of the University of Windsor and chair of the Windsor-Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce. She has been recognized for her service with the YMCA Peace Medallion, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, and Wayne State University's Peacemaker of the Year Award, a first for a Canadian. Jones holds a Doctor of Laws (LL.D.).

You will have a chance to meet Jennifer Jones if you attend the district 5330 (our sister district to the East) Foundation Gala in Rancho Mirage on Saturday October 8. Isaac Hung plans to attend. Contact Isaac if you are interested in attending as well.
