

Las Vegas Southwest Scholarships

The Rotary Club of Las Vegas Southwest is celebrating its 60th anniversary this year. For more than 40 of those years, it has offered a scholarship program.

Each year, the Club awards one \$9,600 academic scholarship to a graduating senior who intends to attend a public college or university in Nevada. The \$1,200 scholarship is awarded on a persemester basis and is renewable for up to 7 semesters of college as long as the applicant maintains a 3.0 GPA and completes a minimum of 12 semester hours per semester. The scholarship is paid directly to the school.

In addition to the 4-year scholarship, from time to time the Club also awards a 1-year scholarship if there are applicants with significant need.

Our program is named the "John and Lou Yoxen Academic Scholarship" in honor of a former Southwest Rotarian who donated a significant sum to our club for scholarships.

Because the program has been so successful, we were the recent beneficiary of a \$25,000 donation from a non-Rotarian who needed someone to administer a scholarship program in honor of her late husband. The result is a \$5,000 annual scholarship titled the "Barry A. Smith Memorial Scholarship" and will be awarded at the same time as our annual scholarship.
