The Rotary Foundation - SHARE Fund and World Fund

The World Fund supports Rotary's highest priority activities around the globe and helps to ensure The Rotary Foundation's ability to fund large-scale, sustainable projects with long-term positive impact. The World Fund's unrestricted contributions ensure critical flexibility for use where it is needed most. Next month, some of our District leaders will join experts as they discuss how The Rotary Foundation uses the World Fund to support its programs and quickly respond to the world's most pressing challenges. Panelists will discuss how the World Fund and Rotary's Endowment are connected today and into the future and how a fully funded Endowment will impact the strength of the World Fund in perpetuity.

The Rotary Foundation also allows for "named" endowment funds under SHARE Fund Endowment. This allows a named fund to be used for a more specific purpose or to allow a percentage to be returned to the district every year in the form of District Designated Funds (DDF). We currently have 13 named endowments in the district. Four of them are specifically listed as SHARE endowments and the district receives approximately \$4,500 from these four funds.

One of our specific endowments is called the J. Carolyn and Joseph B. McMullin Global Grant Scholarship. The fund started with an initial contribution of \$150,000. Since then, more than \$70,000 has been available for scholarships and the fund has grown to over \$180k. If you would like more information on how to consider a "named" endowment (minimum is \$25,000), please do not hesitate to reach out to me or you can go directly to the rotary.org website for more information.

Don't forget to save the May 18th date when we will celebrate those who have contributed to The Rotary Foundation over this past year. The District 5300 Foundation Dinner will highlight a couple of Rotarians who have reached the Major Donor 3 level this year in giving to the Foundation.


