Frank Stephens, Jr. was a starting outside linebacker for UCLA during three of the four years of the 1974-1978 seasons. His team played the Rose Bowl in 1976; and in the Hula Bowl and Japan Bowl in 1978. He would return to the Rose Bowl in 1983-84, this time as UCLA's Undergraduate Coach. In 1978, he tried out for the Seattle Seahawks, then played for the Toronto Argonauts (1979-1980). As a student at San Diego High School, Frank was an adept athlete, being inducted to Prep All-American Football, playing baseball, basketball (*Most Inspirational Player*) and track (*winning All-League 440 yd Relay Team*).

Injury would eventually sideline him as a player, but his love for football would result in his newfound coaching career path as UCLA's Undergraduate Football Coach. After four years, Frank was drawn to a new calling - Restaurant Management, but after five years, in 1990, he returned to UCLA where he would complete a sixteen-year tenure as Director of Student Services for UCLA's Athletic Department.

Frank holds a BA in Sociology from UCLA (1984), and a MS in Educational Administration from National University (2002). He is currently with World Financial Group, consulting clients on their life insurance needs. Frank will give his reflections on how his player and coaching time at UCLA helped prepare him for life's success. Above football and UCLA, his biggest love is for family which includes his daughter, Kayla (*Cum Laude graduate*) finalizing her PhD in Social Services, and who was inducted into the City of Santa Ana Wall of Fame for basketball and son, Alexander, a graduate of Cal State Fullerton in Business & Administration.

Want to make children smile? Operation Santa Claus is Back!






