

From Brazil to Long Beach: Eduardo "Eddie" Paschoalin Continues a Lifelong Rotary Legacy

Long Beach, CA — For Eduardo "Eddie" Paschoalin, joining the Rotary Club of Long Beach isn't just about civic engagement; it's the continuation of a decades-long family commitment to service. Born in Juiz de Fora, Brazil—a city celebrated for its industrial strength and rich culinary traditions—Eddie's path to Long Beach was paved by the enduring influence of the Rotary International movement.

The Foundation of Service

Eddie's connection to Rotary began in the mid-1980s with his father, **Wilson Paschoalin**, who became an active member of a Brazilian Rotary Club and remains dedicated to the organization today. This lifelong commitment profoundly shaped Eddie and his siblings, all of whom participated in the prestigious Rotary Youth Exchange Program.

In 1998–1999, Eddie seized his own opportunity, spending a pivotal year as an exchange student in Fresno, California. During this time, he was deeply involved in local Rotary activities, from philanthropic events to fundraising, often attending meetings alongside his host father, Charles "Chuck" Montgomery.

"The Rotarians in Fresno welcomed me warmly, attending my high school games and making me feel like a true member of their community," Eddie recalls.

Education and a Two-Decade Career

Inspired by the community support he found in California, Eddie applied to U.S. universities. He returned after his exchange year to pursue higher education, ultimately attending the **University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA)**.

While in college, he was recruited by VTAIG, a company that later became part of the Berkshire Hathaway organization. This opportunity launched a successful **21-year career** in the highly demanding automotive industry and corporate acquisitions/finance departments. While his professional responsibilities took precedence, his foundational desire to return to Rotary remained strong.

The Return to Service

In 2021, Eddie founded his own real estate brokerage. This move provided him with greater professional flexibility and immediately **renewed his commitment to community service**.

The final piece of the puzzle fell into place recently after a conversation with his father. Eddie attended a Rotary meeting in Long Beach, where he immediately connected with members **Lisa Hain and Lisa Finn**.

"Our connection was instant, and I felt that same Rotary spirit I grew up with," he notes.

Eddie believes his unique background—combining international experience, professional finance expertise, and a lifelong family dedication to Rotary—positions him perfectly to contribute meaningfully to the Long Beach club.

"I'm eager to serve, to help strengthen our community, and to uphold the values of fellowship and service that have guided my family for generations," Eddie affirms, ready to embark on this next chapter of service in Long Beach.


