

It is my honor to announce and introduce the 2024 Recipient of the Schneider Family Scholarship - Skyler Graham.

Mark and Nancy Schneider have established this Scholarship to support and reward students with a learning challenge, such as ADHD, Dyslexia, and processing disorder, who plan on attending CSULB. More specifically, it is a Scholarship for students who have a learning difference.

Skyler Graham attended a recent Rotary meeting with her parents Kim Powers and Dina Graham who are so proud and beaming, and rightly so. Skyler was an outstanding student at Long Beach Millikan High School and is now attending CSULB, majoring in Marketing with an emphasis on Fashion.

Skyler at a young age noticed a difference between herself and other students starting in middle school. Her friends and, most notably, her twin sister would brag about how easy certain assignments and tests were and she felt embarrassed because they were difficult for her. She figured she just needed to work harder, but the harder she worked, the worse her grades seemed to get. Early help from family, friends and teachers helped Skyler continue, excel in school and thrive as a volunteer in extra-curricular activities -- most notably in fashion and theater-oriented endeavors.

One of her Theater Arts teachers at Millikan, in a letter to the Foundation, says it this way – "Skyler is a hardworking, dependable, and intelligent young woman. She is able to balance her creative side with her academic side very well, taking multiple AP classes while participating in COMPASS (Performing Arts pathway) classes, such as Fashion and Theater Arts, and participating in the school's productions requiring many hours of rehearsal and performances outside of class time. She has managed to keep a 3.56 weighted GPA while participating and, in most cases, acting as a student leader in extracurricular activities at Millikan".

RCLB Membership Drive (in case you missed it)

So, you have a Membership Prospect. Now what?

Rotarian Dr. Lynne Wainfan reached out to me with this exact question and suggested we share these steps with Rotarians — especially given the fact that we are in a **Membership Drive!**

Here is a very simplified version of the steps:

- Identify a Candidate.
- 2. Tell them why you like Rotary and why you think they would this is a very important step to explaining the work we do as the Rotary Club of LB.
- 3. Invite them to a meeting or to Rotary Connections getting to know other Rotarians is a great way to show a Candidate what you have learned and know about the benefits of serving in Rotary. Getting to know other Rotarians will help you select a Second Sponsor.
- 4. Once the Candidate is ready to join, has attended a Lunch Meeting and/or Connections event, complete the Membership Proposal Form. You will need to sit down with the Candidate to answer the questions and have the Second Sponsor complete their portion. This Form is then submitted to the Rotary Office and Madrid takes it from there.
