Since 2001, **Jim Michaelian** has served as the President/CEO of the Grand Prix Association of Long Beach, LLC (GPALB). He has been with the organization since its inception in 1975 as a Formula 5000 race, serving in a number of functional areas including finance, operations and marketing. He served as the company's controller prior to the first Toyota Grand Prix of Long Beach, and as Chief Operating Officer from 1998-2001.

In his current role, Michaelian is responsible for the overall management of the annual Acura Grand Prix of Long Beach, as well as its subsidiary, Grand Prix Special Events, which specializes in temporary structure rentals for such events as the Academy Awards, Emmy Awards, EDC/Las Vegas, and various other special events.

A graduate of UCLA with a B.S. in Physics and an M.B.A., Michaelian also serves on the board of directors of the Grand Prix Foundation, the Long Beach Convention and Visitors Bureau, and LA Sports Council.

He holds a competition driver's license and has participated in several endurance races including the 24 Hours of Daytona, the 12 Hours of Sebring, Nürburgring, Le Mans, Spa and Dubai. A California native, Michaelian resides in Seal Beach with his wife, Mary, and has two adult sons.
