Gayl Murphy's fine-tuned news gathering skills have been sought-after by news organizations worldwide as the go-to reporter who can give fast, accurate story coverage to news outlets -- past and present, local, national, and international.

Gayl has an innate sense of how to connect with an audience, The Hollywood Reporter acknowledged her and calls her a "media pro." While another inside Hollywood publication, Performance Magazine, described her as "L.A.'s original on-air radio reporter covering the Hollywood scene from the ground up!"

News happens fast, with so many new and innovating ways of delivering it - Murphy is always ready and able to go "live", broadcasting with no pre-recorded media packages. She's known for getting the scoop on what's hot and what's not in TV and film. Talking about breaking headlines, she digs into news stories exposing the celebrity do-gooders, trending showbiz stories and gets the details on what people are talking about.

Murphy was one of the very first American entertainment journalists to travel to China to report on the state of popular music and culture. "I was invited to cover a Jan and Dean Tour in China for a month. The band were part of a cultural exchange between the two countries, bringing 'Surf City USA' music to the sleeping giant in Beijing, Shanghai and 6 others cities in China. Less than six months after the second tour...student protests erupted at Tiananmen Square and we all know how that went."

In addition to news assignments in Beijing, Shanghai and Berlin, Murphy's travels in search for a great showbiz story have taken her through Europe, Canada, Mexico, The Caribbean, Costa Rica and Japan. In her on-air career, she estimates she's interviewed more than 15,000+ celebrities in entertainment and business.
