Two at-large members from the Rotary Club are added to the LBRCF Board for a three-year term. The criteria for selecting these members are established by the Rotary Club of Long Beach's Board of Directors.

Nominees must:

- Be active members of the Rotary Club of Long Beach for at least three years.
- Have held a leadership role or contributed significantly to a sanctioned project within the Club.
- Demonstrate a commitment to our Club's values and be ready to fulfill LBRCF duties if selected.

The President's Council is tasked with selecting two nominees annually from the Rotary Club membership. Here's how it works:

Nominations are solicited in March via the RotaryGram and weekly Club meetings.

- In April, the President's Council reviews nominations and selects two nominees to serve on the LBRCF Board for three years, starting in July.
- The selected individuals are presented to the Rotary Club of Long Beach's Board of Directors for approval in May.


