"Pier Wind: Powering Long Beach's Economy with Green Energy"

The Port of Long Beach is powering the nation's resilient energy future with the proposed development of Pier Wind, the largest facility in the U.S. designed to accommodate the assembly of floating offshore wind turbines.

Pier Wind would involve creating 400 acres of new land for a terminal capable of handling heavy lift crane operations to stage, store and construct some of the world's largest offshore wind turbines, standing as tall as the Eiffel Tower.

The Port of Long Beach is a global leader in green port initiatives and top-notch customer service, moving cargo with reliability, speed and efficiency. As the premier U.S. gateway for trans-Pacific trade, the Port handles trade valued at \$200 billion annually and supports 2.6 million jobs across the United States, including 575,000 in Southern California. In 2024, industry leaders named it "The Best West Coast Seaport in North America" for the sixth consecutive year.

Suzanne Plezia is the Senior Director and Chief Harbor Engineer for the Port of Long Beach, with over 28 years of experience in port development. She began her career in 1996 at the Port of Long Beach and was promoted to her current role in 2017 where she oversees the Engineering Services Bureau's six divisions - Program Management, Construction Management, Project Controls, Survey, Engineering Design, and Maintenance. These six divisions are responsible for the Port of Long Beach's infrastructure asset management and 10-year, \$2.3 billion, capital development program.

Suzanne is also leading the Port of Long Beach's \$4.7 billion Pier Wind project - a proposed 400-acre purpose-built facility for floating offshore wind turbine staging, integration, and foundation assembly. Suzanne earned her B.S. in Civil Engineering from the University of California, Irvine, and is a California licensed Professional Civil Engineer and certified Maritime Port Executive.


From a weed-choked former Pacific Electric Red Car right-of-way in a greenspace-deprived neighborhood, in 2004-2005 the Rotary Club of Long Beach partnered with L.B. Parks, Recreation. and Marine to

develop what is now our beautiful Rotary Centennial Park.

Under the leadership and vision of then-president **Mark Bixby**, **RCLB President #87**, we responded to Rotary International's challenge to all clubs throughout the world to create a permanent physical community benefit to commemorate the 1905 founding of Rotary.

Dedicated on February 23, 2005, the park features what are now beautiful mature shade trees, two children's play areas, and a winding path through educational art installations representing the planets in our solar system (including Pluto) and a large, accurate stainless steel sundial - created and donated by Mark's friend, renowned sculptural artist Patrick Vogel.
