

Second, our next meeting is Thursday, May 8 from 5:30-7 pm.


It will be held at the State Farm Office of Steve and Lori Dwight at 4625 East Anaheim Blvd in Long Beach.

Long Beach Rotary Scholarship Foundation Annual Check Presentations

Presenting checks to Long Beach City College (LBCC) and California State University Long Beach (CSULB) is one of the many annual highlights for the Long Beach Rotary Scholarship Foundation (LBRSF).

The presentation to LBCC was made on the day the Rotary Club of Long Beach met at the City College Trades, Technology and Community Learning Campus for an exciting tour! The Rotary Club of Long Beach began financial loans in 1929 to LBCC students in the Trades. It was a significant experience this year for the Long Beach Rotary Scholarship Foundation to present a \$125,950. check providing 101 scholarships to LBCC students.



The next week, Rotarians gathered at their annual visit to a CSULB athletic event - this year at Blair Field with the Dirtbags vs. USC. Prior to the game, the Long Beach Beach Rotary Scholarship Foundation presented a \$328,250. check providing 137 scholarships to CSULB students.



And, our own Past Rotary President #87, Kay Cofield, threw the 1st pitch! Special thanks to Rotary President #71 and LBRSF Past Chair, Craig Dougherty, for generously winning the 'auction to pitch' and gifting Kay the opportunity to pitch. Kay was presented the ball and she graciously gave it to Craig!
