

#### **This Week's Program**



**PAMELA BOZANICH** served as the lead Prosecuting Attorney in the first trial of Lyle and Erik Menendez, brothers from Beverly Hills who were accused of murdering their parents, Jose and Kitty Menendez in 1989. Central to the prosecution's strategy was Bozanich's efforts to portray the killings as pre-meditated and motivated by financial gain. While the 1990-1993 murder trial would ultimately result in a hung jury, Bozanich's expertise and lead involvement in the high-profile murder case would solidify her reputation in the legal community. In 1996, the brothers were retried again by another prosecutor, this time together in front of a single jury, and found guilty on two counts of first-degree murder, being sentenced to life in prison without parole. Now, thirty years later, the case is experiencing heightened renewed interest due to several feature films on Netflix and Oxygen, resulting in public pleas for the release of the Menendez Brothers.

Having worked for the Organized Crime and Special Trial Divisions for the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office for 24 years, Bozanich's work would involve murder and child abuse cases, including serving as attorney on another highly publicized case - the second McMartin pre-school molestation trial.

Bozanich was born in Kittery, Maine and graduated from Wellesley College, and University of Southern California Law School. She and her husband have lived in Naples, Long Beach for nearly four decades, and have a daughter and two grandsons living in Montana.
