


This Week's Program



Mark Whicker was the sports columnist at the Orange County Register for 35 years, until his retirement in 2022. He had a 49year career in newspapers, working professionally in his hometown of Winston-Salem, N.C. as well as Philadelphia and Dallas. Twice, the Associated Press Sports Editors added him to their list of Top 10 sports columnists, and he is a member of the U.S. Basketball Writers Hall of Fame. In 2014 he won the Nat Fleischer Award from the Boxing Writers of America for distinguished commentary. He was also named Sportswriter of the Year in Pennsylvania (1979) and North Carolina (1975) by the National Sports Media Association.

Mark is the author of "Don Drysdale: Up And In," the biography of the Dodgers' Hall of Fame pitcher of the 1960s. He began writing plays in 2020, and in January of 2025 the Long Beach Playhouse produced his play, "Ted Turner And The Last Roundup." On six other occasions, his plays have been performed as stage readings.

Mark lives in Long Beach with his wife Robyn, who was a sportswriter at the Los Angeles Times, and their son Philip.


What: Volunteer reading with children for our Reading by 9 program
