



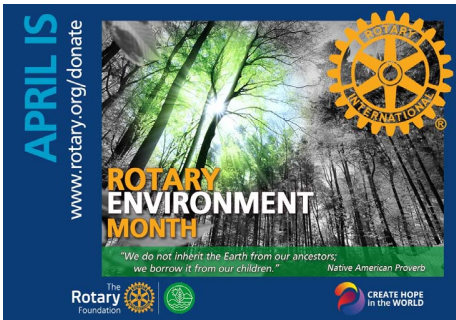

TRF: What are the Best Financial Practices for Grant Funds?

Because grant funds come from donor contributions, it's important for sponsors to manage these funds prudently, transparently, and in accordance with Rotary Foundation policies.

Some good ways to do that are to:



- Follow your spending plan to distribute and use grant funds for their stated purpose and in a timely manner.
- Make project-related payments by check or other traceable method.
- If payments are made electronically by one person, maintain a paper record showing that the payment was approved by both signatories.
- Maintain detailed receipts and record each transaction. Your ledger should list each transaction and note the date, the amount, and the reason for it.
- Share information so you can manage grant payments smoothly and keep funds secure.

Thank you for helping Rotary maintain the highest level of grant oversight.

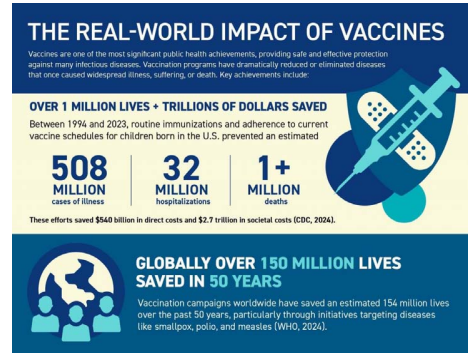

The Magic of Technology: Transforming Lives at St. Andrew's Children's Clinic

In today's fast-paced world of electronics, apps, and technology, it's easy to overlook the profound impact these advancements can have on lives. At St. Andrew's Children's Clinic in Nogales, AZ, technology is not just a tool—it's a lifeline for children facing communication challenges.

On clinic days, the Augmentative-Alternative Communication department becomes a hub of hope and innovation. The staff works tirelessly to guide children and their parents into the transformative world of nonverbal communication. Using cutting-edge teaching tools and iPads, they empower children with speech delays or nonverbal conditions to express themselves in ways they never thought possible. Whether through hand gestures or even eye movements, these children are discovering their voices in remarkable ways.

One such heartwarming story is that of Lia, a young girl with Chromosome 22q33 deletion syndrome, which causes global developmental delays and prevents her from communicating verbally. Lia has been using sign language to communicate, but during a recent session, she experienced a breakthrough. With the help of a specialized app, Lia was able to

“speak” with her mother for the first time. Witnessing her joy and progress brought tears to everyone's eyes, a testament to the magic of technology and



the human spirit.

This incredible work is made possible by the dedication of the clinic's medical team, the unwavering commitment of parents, and the boundless energy and hope of the children themselves. At St. Andrew's Children's Clinic, technology is not just a convenience—it's a powerful force for change, opening doors to a world of opportunities for children who need it most.

You Can Help

The clinic in Nogales, AZ serves patients and their families on the first Thursday of each month. Individuals cross the border to attend a clinic. The Augmentative-Alternative Communication department is among several departments dedicated to serving children. Volunteers are essential for supporting clinic operations. Standard hours are 7:00 AM to 2:00 PM, although volunteer shifts may vary according to specific assignments. The band leaders said that these much-needed funds support everything from instrument repairs to new instruments, curriculum, new music, music stands, competition entrance fees and travel to festivals.

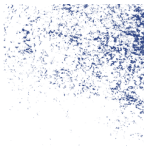

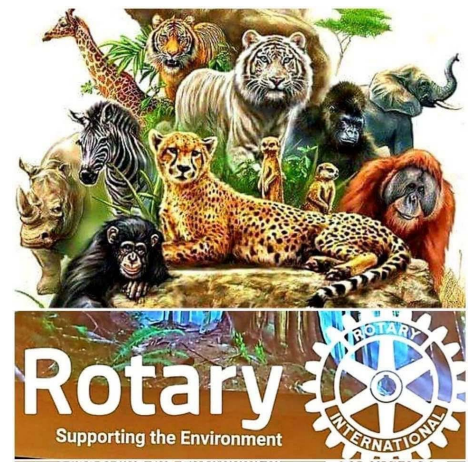
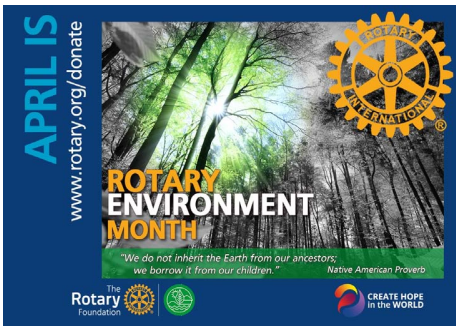
