A special thank you to the Tucson Area and Yuma Area Rotary Clubs for leading River Clean-up efforts along the Rillito and Colorado Rivers.



District Training Assembly



The Valle Verde Rotary Club has entered the competition with full enthusiasm and has created teams within the club hosting weekly auctions and events to increase interest and donations.


