A Quick Tip for Supporting Young People in Need

Mental health is something we all have, but rarely talk about or practice when it comes to keeping the mind healthy. In fact, mental health refers to a person's emotional, psychological, and social well-being. It affects how individuals think, feel, and act, as well as how they handle stress, relate to others, and make choices. Good mental health allows people to cope with the normal stresses of life, work productively, and contribute to their communities. Mental health is important at every stage of life, from childhood through adulthood.

Unfortunately, our youth—your kids if they are between the ages of 9 and 17, and your grandchildren—are having a tough time managing everyday challenges and stress. Anxiety, depression, and even suicide have all increased

tough time managing everyday challenges and stress. Anxiety, depression, and even suicide have all increased among young people. In fact, nearly 1 in 3 high school students report feeling sad or hopeless almost every day for two weeks or more, and suicide is now the second leading cause of death among youth ages 10–14. The U.S. Surgeon General has declared youth mental health a national crisis.

The good news is there are strategies we can use to support our young people. Here are two things you can do right now:

- 1. Listen without judgment. Sometimes just being present and letting a young person express themselves can help them feel seen and supported.
- 2. Normalize talking about emotions. Make mental health a regular topic in your home or classroom—just like we talk about physical health, we should talk about how we feel emotionally.

When adults create safe spaces for young people to open up, it can make a real difference in how they cope, grow, and thrive.

The other step you can take is by participating in the District 5500 Mental Health Action Committee. We meet on the 3rd Tuesday of every month from 5:30–6:30 virtually. If interested please contact jamal@lpknc.org.




Some amazing people from Rotary will be there, along with Scouts and members of the community. If you've ever wanted to be part of something bigger than yourself, this is one of those days.


