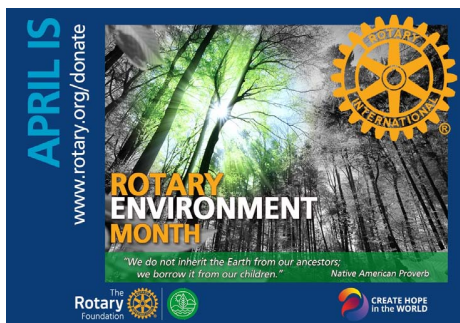

### First Environment Club in AZ Is Thriving!



The Rotary Club of Tucson Verde in D5500 is the first cause-based club to protect the environment in Arizona. It was chartered in 2021 with 31 charter members, 27 of whom were new Rotarians.

PDG/Charter President, Michael Drake, has been instrumental in taking advantage of District and Global Grants to do projects both locally and overseas. The club used a District Grant to install solar panels for electricity for remote residents on the Navajo reservation in northern Arizona. To remediate a denuded watershed that polluted Lake Tuxpan in Valle de Iguala in D4185 in central Mexico, they received a Global Grant.

Other significant projects include removal of invasive buffelgrass and arundo cane from local riparian areas, a community garden for disabled elementary school children to grow vegetables, and an annual tour for the public of homes constructed with environmentally sensitive features.

The club meets in person twice a month. The fifth anniversary is a milestone and Tucson Verde Rotary is thriving!

To understand human trafficking: **“The unlawful act of transporting or coercing people in order to benefit from their work or service, typically in the form of forced labor or sexual exploitation.”** experts often use the “Action-Means-Purpose” framework:

**Action:** The trafficker recruits, transports, or harbors a person.

**Means:** They use force (violence), fraud (false job promises), or coercion (threats to family or legal status). **Purpose:** The goal is to exploit the person for forced labor or commercial sex acts.

**Learn how to:**

Identify and rescue victims

Support trauma healing and recovery

Understand social media exploitation

Strengthen community response

Human trafficking awareness focuses on identifying and preventing modern-day slavery, which involves exploiting people for profit through force, fraud, or coercion.

Hear from Hope Rising AZ, Southern Arizona Against Slavery (SAAS), and legal experts, including a Special Victims Prosecutor.

### Rotary Club of Marana Supports Local Educators Through Treasures 4 Teachers



The Rotary Club of Marana is proud to support educators across southern Arizona through a partnership with Treasures 4 Teachers (T4T), a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing affordable classroom materials to teachers. Their Treasures On the Go program now serves schools throughout Pima County, bringing essential supplies directly to campuses where they are needed most.

Treasures 4 Teachers offers a wide range of lowcost, repurposed materials—everything from paper towel rolls and plastic containers to books, fabric scraps, magnets, and twist ties. These items, often overlooked as everyday recyclables, become valuable tools for hands-on learning and creative classroom projects. In addition, T4T provides discounted new supplies such as dry-erase markers, laminating sheets, bags, and decorative crafting materials.

Teachers can access these resources by purchasing a T4T membership after providing their teaching credentials. This membership allows educators to obtain classroom materials at a fraction of typical retail cost, easing the financial burden many teachers face when purchasing supplies out of pocket.



Recently, members of the Rotary Club of Marana visited several Marana Unified School District elementary schools to deliver Treasures On the Go bags filled with classroom supplies. Along with the bags, the club also awarded T4T memberships to teachers, ensuring they can continue accessing affordable materials throughout the year.

This project reflects Rotary's ongoing commitment to supporting local schools, empowering educators, and strengthening the community we serve.

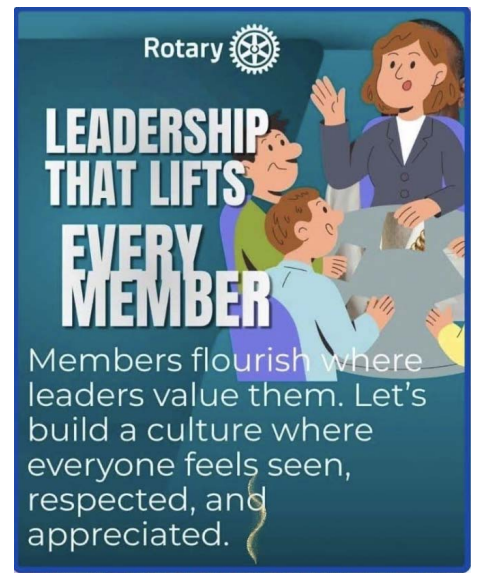
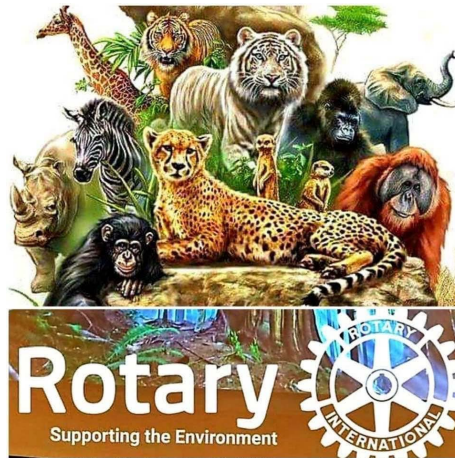
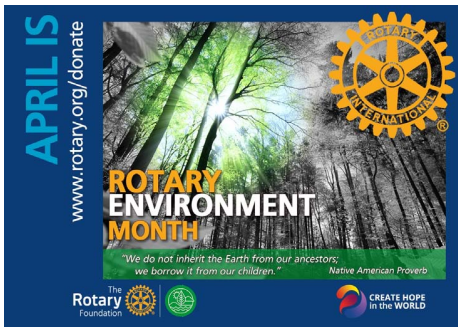
