## Gary Hirsch Receives Rotary International Service Award

**Optimistic. Dedicated. Persistent.** These are the qualities that define Rotarians around the world—qualities that have driven the success of **PolioPlus** and fueled our unwavering commitment to ending polio forever.



These words echoed at the District Governor Installation event when DG Sue Archibald presented **Gary Hirsch** of the Tucson Rotary Club with the **International Service Award for a Polio-Free World for 2024–2025** in recognition for his significant, hands-on service toward the goal of polio eradication—not just in our Rotary region, but on a global scale.

To give you an idea of the significance of this award, only a maximum of 60 such awards are given out annually across the globe.

Gary's contributions are extraordinary. Since the inception of the **District 5500 Ride to End Polio** in 2008, Gary has been at the heart of the effort. As a founding member of the organizing committee, he helped launch what began as a modest initiative among five local Rotary clubs. Today, he continues to serve as Chair of the Leadership Committee.

Thanks in no small part to Gary's vision and leadership, the D5500 Ride to End Polio has raised over **\$75 million** to date, including the matching funds from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. These funds are vital to distributing wild polio vaccines and bringing us closer to Rotary's shared goal: a world free of polio.




