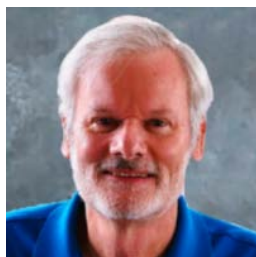

Rotary is one of the rare places where that realization can become a calling.

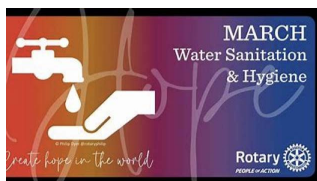

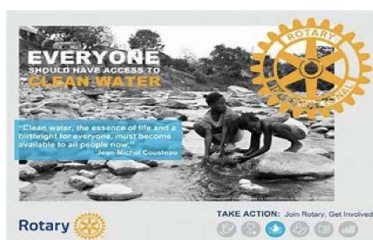
March is Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene Month!

March – Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene Month



Every month, Rotary shines a spotlight on one of the areas where our global network creates meaningful impact. In March, that focus is **Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH)**—one of the most fundamental building blocks of healthy, thriving communities.

Access to clean water and safe sanitation is something many of us rarely have to think about in our daily lives. Yet for billions of people around the world, it remains a daily challenge. According to global estimates, more than two billion people still lack access to safely managed drinking water, and even more live without adequate sanitation facilities. Through projects led by clubs, districts, and Rotary Action Groups, Rotarians around the world are building wells, installing water purification systems, constructing sanitation facilities, and providing hygiene education. Our district has a proud history of supporting international water projects, and many of our clubs continue to partner with communities and organizations to bring clean water to areas where it is desperately needed. What is the RI Council on Legislation? Part II

Question of the Week



What is the Council on Legislation?

A: The Council on Legislation is Rotary's Parliament. It meets every three years in Chicago for enactments and every year on line for resolutions. Each of the Rotary districts worldwide chooses a representative, Past-Governor, for a three-year term. These members represent their districts at all three meetings of the Council on Resolutions and at the Council on Legislation during their term.

The **RI Council on Legislation** and the **Council on Resolutions** give all Rotarians a voice in how our organization is governed. The **Council on Resolutions will meet** online this **October 2026**.

Can a Club propose a Resolution?

Yes. Any Rotary club may propose resolutions to the Rotary International Council on Resolutions.

How?

Starting with the 2026 Council on Resolutions, the format for resolutions has been simplified. There are three steps that the proposer must complete.

Resolution statement: The resolution statement states the action that the proposer wishes the RI Board or TRF Trustees to consider. For examples of resolutions, see the most recent Council on Resolutions results.

Optional proposer's purpose and effect statement: The proposer's purpose and effect statement is the argument for adopting the resolution. Statements are optional and do not need to be included in the submission. Consider answering questions such as:

- Why is the resolution being proposed?
- What problem is it trying to solve?
- Why is it important to adopt the resolution?

District Approval: Resolutions proposed by clubs or districts must be endorsed, or approved, by the clubs in the district at a district legislation meeting, or through a club ballot. The District Governor confirm the district's endorsement.

Note: If the resolution would have a significant financial impact on Rotary International or The Rotary Foundation, financial impact statements are drafted by the RI Secretariat, not the proposer. Any financial impact information included by the proposer is removed.

Tips for proposed resolutions:

- Refer to the Resolution Planning worksheet to thoughtfully consider your proposed resolution.
- Review "How to Propose Resolutions" and FAQs at my.rotary.org.

Is There Additional Help Available?

Yes, Past and current district representatives, members of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee, and Council Services staff members are all very knowledgeable about drafting resolutions. They can provide assistance if you need help or have questions.

What is the deadline for submission?

June 30, 2026 is the deadline for proposed resolutions to be considered at the October 2026 Council on Resolutions.

TRF: What is a Global Grant Scholarship?



Through Rotary Foundation global grants, members can support future leaders whose career goals align with fields related to our areas of focus.

These scholarships are awarded for at least US\$30,000 and can fund graduate-level coursework or research for one to four academic years.

A key feature of global grants is the partnership between the district or club where the person will study and the district or club in their home country.

When they return home, scholarship recipients are expected to talk with Rotary members and others about how their experiences led to a greater understanding of their host country and how they'll continue to support our areas of focus and spread goodwill and understanding.

To understand human trafficking: **“The unlawful act of transporting or coercing people in order to benefit from their work or service, typically in the form of forced labor or sexual exploitation.”** experts often use the "Action-Means-Purpose" framework:

Action: The trafficker recruits, transports, or harbors a person.

Means: They use force (violence), fraud (false job promises), or coercion (threats to family or legal status).

Purpose: The goal is to exploit the person for forced labor or commercial sex acts.

Learn how to:

Identify and rescue victims

Support trauma healing and recovery

Understand social media exploitation

Strengthen community response

Human trafficking awareness focuses on identifying and preventing modern-day slavery, which involves exploiting people for profit through force, fraud, or coercion.

Hear from Hope Rising AZ, Southern Arizona Against Slavery (SAAS), and legal experts, including a Special Victims Prosecutor.

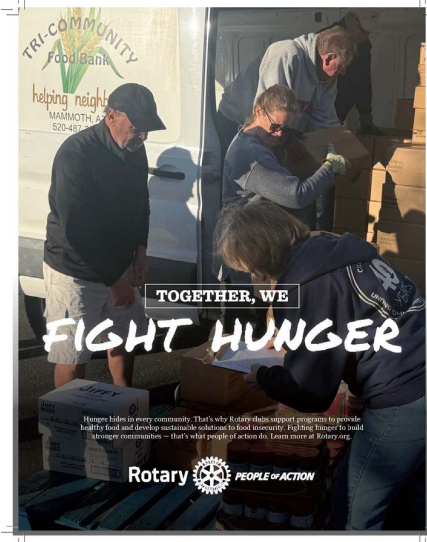

Combating Hunger in the Copper Corridor

The Saddlebrooke Sunrise Rotary Club has a long partnership supporting the Tri-Community Food Bank. Members volunteer as monthly orders are received at a local grocery and the Food Bank's warehouse and distribution site. Timely handling of fruits and vegetables, meat and shelf-stable foods and kitchen staples are essential to meet the agency's rising demand for services.

Saddlebrooke Sunrise Rotarians serve families in need along the Copper Corridor with their support for the Tri-Community Food Bank (TCFB) in Mammoth, AZ. Four times monthly, club members help TCFB volunteers pick up orders at Bashas in Catalina and unload at the warehouse as well as support the unloading and processing of federal food bank donations received by the Food Bank. The support of the Rotary Club volunteers ensures timely handling and processing of fresh and shelf-stable food. Club members organize and count orders and donations as well as help fill orders for families on distribution days. TCFB has seen a surge in demand for families in everything from canned goods, fruits and vegetables to pet food. TCFB serves Arizonans in Aravaipa, Mammoth, Oracle,
