The Rotary Youth Exchange program offers high school students in District 5500 the life-changing opportunity to study abroad through either a short-term or long-term exchange. Participants immerse themselves in a new culture, attend school, and live with host families-fostering international understanding, personal growth, and global friendships.

#### **Exchange Options**

- Long-Term Exchange: A full academic year abroad, with students attending school and living with multiple host families.
- Short-Term Exchange: A summer exchange lasting a few weeks, typically as a family-to-family experience.

Students serve as ambassadors of their home countries while gaining valuable life skills and new perspectives. Thanks to the support of Rotary clubs, this transformative experience is accessible to a diverse range of students.

#### A Hosting Experience to Remember

This year, DGND Leo Lawrenson and his family hosted exchange student Javier from Spain.

"Javier was a joy for our club and family to host," says Leo. "He was a model student, a great athlete, and a kind, caring young man. # One of District 5500's Best Kept Secrets

Many of you have heard of the Rotary District 5500 Charitable Fund, and several clubs around the district participate in the Charitable Fund. But several years ago, PDG Joe Hentges called it one of our District's best-kept secrets. I still think it is.

There are several benefits in using the Charitable Fund. According to PDG Michael Drake, a Rotary Foundation expert, a major benefit is for clubs that don't want the expense and maintenance of a club foundation. Our district's Charitable Fund is a 501(c)(3) and is available to stand in. Since it doesn't raise funds of its own and is instead simply a pass-through, donations that benefit a club are paid into it, the donor gets a tax deduction, and the club directs the Fund Treasurer where to pay out the funds, usually to the club itself, or to a particular charity.

Rotarians are encouraged to check out the D5500 Operations Manual here to get all of the information on our Charitable Fund, a Tax-Exempt Arizona Non-Profit Corporation.




