



### Wanna go Phishing?

#### NO, YOU DON'T!

From Wikipedia: "Phishing is a form of social engineering and a scam where attackers deceive people into revealing sensitive information or installing malware such as viruses, worms, adware, or ransomware." We have been receiving reports from other Rotary Districts about mass emails received by multiple members who thought they were from District leadership, asking them to click on various links for what appeared to be legitimate or interesting topics, but which would actually take them to websites that were scams.

Some of the phished Rotarians blamed ClubRunner or DACdb, since they usually received emails through those club management systems, but in actuality neither platform had been breached or compromised, even for the email addresses! The scammers had likely used public Rotary websites to get the names of leaders to use on their phishing emails and got the member email addresses from any of the multiple other public sources for email contact lists, some legitimate and some not. #### TRF Weekly Message: What Can a \$1000 Gift to the Rotary Foundation Do?

A \$1,000 contribution to The Rotary Foundation pays for the materials needed to build a deep bore well in India that will supply clean drinking water to more than 300 people.

It provides materials to treat and prevent parasites and anemia in children in Brazil or pays for a tree nursery in Jamaica that will help 700 farmers increase their income.

It can provide cow and animal husbandry training to a woman in Uganda, where children often don't get enough protein and calcium.

It can pay for the polio vaccine for 2,000 children in Nigeria or provide \$50 microloans that allow 20 women in Nicaragua to start businesses.



# One of District 5500's Best Kept Secrets

Many of you have heard of the Rotary District 5500 Charitable Fund, and several clubs around the district participate in the Charitable Fund. But several years ago, PDG Joe Hentges called it one of our District's best-kept secrets. I still think it is.

There are several benefits in using the Charitable Fund. According to PDG Michael Drake, a Rotary Foundation expert, a major benefit is for clubs that don't want the expense and maintenance of a club foundation. Our district's Charitable Fund is a 501(c)(3) and is available to stand in. Since it doesn't raise funds of its own and is instead simply a pass-through,



donations that benefit a club are paid into it, the donor gets a tax deduction, and the club directs the Fund Treasurer where to pay out the funds, usually to the club itself, or to a particular charity.

Rotarians are encouraged to check out the D5500 Operations Manual here to get all of the information on our Charitable Fund, a Tax-Exempt Arizona Non-Profit Corporation.


